How We Pray

When the priest quietly prays "Wash me, O Lord, from my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin" while washing his hands at the altar, he isn't performing a practical cleaning. It's a ritual purification that reminds us that the one offering the sacrifice must also seek God's mercy. This silent prayer connects the Mass to the ancient priestly rituals of the Temple, where purification came before sacrifice.

FIRST READING (Isaiah 35)

Please Be Seated

The desert and the parched land will exult; the steppe will rejoice and bloom. They will bloom with abundant flowers, and rejoice with joyful song. The glory of Lebanon will be given to them, the splendor of Carmel and Sharon; they will see the glory of the LORD, the splendor of our God. Strengthen the hands that are feeble, make firm the knees that are weak, say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, fear not! Here is your God, he comes with vindication; with divine recompense he comes to save you. Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared; then will the lame leap like a stag, then the tongue of the mute will sing. Those whom the LORD has ransomed will return and enter Zion singing, crowned with everlasting joy; they will meet with joy and gladness, sorrow and mourning will flee.

How We Pray

At the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer, when the priest says "Lift up your hearts" ("Sursum Corda"), the Church teaches that we are not just being encouraged emotionally—liturgically, we are being invited to enter the heavenly liturgy. In that moment, the earthly Mass is united with the eternal worship of heaven, meaning we are praying alongside angels, saints, and all who have gone before us.

SECOND READING (JAMES 5)

Be patient, brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient with it until it receives the early and the late rains. You too must be patient. Make your hearts firm, because the coming of the Lord is at hand. Do not complain, brothers and sisters, about one another, that you may not be judged. Behold, the Judge is standing before the gates. Take as an example of hardship and patience, brothers and sisters, the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

How We Pray

During the Gloria, when we say “We praise You, we bless You, we adore You, we glorify You,” the Church is intentionally stacking multiple forms of praise. This isn’t poetic repetition—each verb corresponds to a distinct biblical way of worshiping God. The Gloria is one of the oldest Christian hymns still used at Mass, and praying it unites us with the earliest generations of believers who proclaimed God’s glory using these very same words.

SIGN OF PEACE

At this time the congregation will offer one another a sign of peace; some embracing, some shaking hands, etc. This gesture flows from Christ’s teaching to make peace with others as we approach the altar.
