FIRST READING (Sirach 3) *Please Be Seated*

God sets a father in honor over his children; a mother's authority he confirms over her sons. Whoever honors his father atones for sins, and preserves himself from them. How We Pray

At every Mass, the prayers of the priest are almost always spoken in the plural—"we," "us," and "our"—even when you attend alone. This reminds us that the Mass is never a private prayer; it is always the prayer of the whole Church, united on earth and in heaven.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew
