


The CCCC funeral meal team comes together to provide service to the family and friends of our deceased parishioners with food and drink. We work in conjunction with the Funeral Mass Planning Ministry which Katherine Miller assists families with.

The Funeral Mass Planning Ministry assists families with the order and rites of a Catholic funeral service. Families are provided resources to assist in their decision making for biblical and gospel readings, music, and special requests, (i.e. streaming services, solos, and/or preferred lectors when possible). This ministry also recruits Eucharist ministers, ushers, servers, and lectors for the service. The services are always scheduled and coordinated with Fr. Titus and Deacon Cumby. Pastor's Word

Let us offer ourselves the gifts of showing our repentance and renewal of life during Lent by producing fruits of love, mercy, forgiveness, and selfless service, instead of remaining like a barren fig tree in Christ's Church and so become a sacrifice sweet and acceptable to God.

Repentance is the first step in our redemption. Jesus gives us a strong warning, "If you do not repent, you will all perish as they did." We are called to abandon our false gods of money, power, and pleasure and return to the one God, Who "secures justice and the rights of all the oppressed."

Let us repent and reform our lives and produce the fruits of the Holy Spirit. With the parable of the barren fig tree, Jesus warns us that the merciful God, will not put up with us indefinitely. Nurse's Corner

Prevent Heart Disease

There are several risk factors for heart disease, many of which can be changed. Those risk factors that cannot be changed are age, gender, family history and race. People over age 40 are at greater risk for heart disease. Heart disease is more common in males and in people with a family history of the disease. The disease is also more common in the African American population.

Those risk factors that can be controlled include obesity, elevated cholesterol levels 240 milligrams or more), high blood pressure, excessive alcohol consumption, smoking, physical inactivity, uncontrolled diabetes and stress.

Here is The Good News: You don't have to be a victim of heart disease. You can lower your risk factors, prevent heart disease and even reverse some forms of cardiovascular disease by developing a healthy lifestyle through improving your diet and establishing an exercise plan that you work consistently.

A healthy diet should consist of plenty of fruits, vegetables and foods high in fiber, low in fat, cholesterol and salt. Baked and broiled food should replace fried foods and limit the intake of butter, eggs and dairy products. Chicken, turkey and fish can be substituted for red meat and pork. Alcohol consumption should be limited to no more than one drink per day. Begin a regular exercise program. Regardless of your age, you are never too old to exercise. Walking is a highly recommended form of exercise along with swimming and bicycling. Always talk with your doctor or health care provider before beginning any exercise program. If you are a smoker, kick the habit. If your doctor has prescribed medication for you, take it as directed.

Remember there are steps you can take to improve your heart health.
