

Pastor's Word

How are you today? We have our Lenten Spiritual journey with the Lord for four weeks and we have come close to Holy Week. Let's keep praying and following Jesus in the desert.

In two weeks, we celebrate Palm Sunday which commemorates Jesus Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem. According to the Gospel's of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, crowd's welcomed Jesus by waving palm branches and laying them on the ground, celebrating Him as the Messiah. This moment is significant because it highlights Jesus' role as a leader and Savior, fulfilling ancient prophecies. Let us welcome Jesus as our Savior. The Palm Sunday inaugurates the Holy Week.

We will be gathered together in the Parish Hall in which the palm branches will be blessed and sprinkled with Holy Water to be distributed to the congregation. It is followed by the solemn procession into the Church while on the way, we honor Jesus with hymns and prayers.

The reading of the Passion of Christ's story according to St. Luke is a significant part of the Palm Sunday service. It fore-shadows the eventf of Good Friday and emphasizes the redemptive nature of Jesus' sacrifice.

Palm Sunday serves as a pivotal moment in the Christian liturgical calendar as it bridges the joyful celebration of Christ's entry into Jerusalem and the somber remembrances of his crucifixion less than a week later. This tension between joy and sorrow encapsulates the essence of Christian faith: hope through sacrifice and resurrection.

The blessed palms are often taken home, serving as a reminder of faith and commitment and brought back to the Church in the following year to be burned that will be used as ash to be put on our forehead on the Ash Wednesday.
