Pastor's Word

Holy Thursday is the commemoration of the Last Supper of Jesus Christ, when he established the sacrament of Holy Communion prior to his arrest and crucifixion. It also commemorates His institution of the priesthood for his disciples, which is distinct from the “priesthood of all believers.” Christ washed the feet of his Disciples, who would become the first priests.

On the night of Holy Thursday, Eucharistic Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament takes place where the faithful remain in the presence of the Eucharist just as the Disciples kept a vigil with Christ.

Good Friday is the day on which Catholics commemorate the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. According to the gospels, Jesus was betrayed by Judas on the night of the Last Supper. The morning following, he was brought before Annas, who condemned Jesus for blasphemy for refusing to repudiate Annas' words that He was the Son of God. From there, Jesus was sent to Pontius Pilate, the Roman governor of the province.

The narrative of the Passion of Jesus is accompanying us to see the salvific value of the passion and death of Jesus.

Easter Vigil begins outside of the church in the dark, with the kindling of the Easter fire from which the Paschal Candle will be lit and brought in solemn procession into the darkened church. The congregants follow behind the celebrant in procession: this is Isreal, led by the column of fire from Egyptian slavery to freedom.

From that one Paschal Candle, the faithful receive their light. As the Paschal Candle makes its way to the altar, the progressive illumination of the church from darkness to light by candlelight is palpable: Christ Our Light has put aside the darkness.

The *Exsultet*, an ancient hymn captures the significance and meaning of Easter while reinforcing an awareness of the transcendence of what Christ accomplished.

The Paschal Vigil envisions up to nine readings which relive the creation, humanity's journey back to freedom, prophets and the New Testament. All prefigure aspects of the Resurrection.

May we all recognize Jesus who loves us so much that he suffered passion and death on the cross for our sins to make us rise up with Him in His Resurrection. Happy Easter to you!

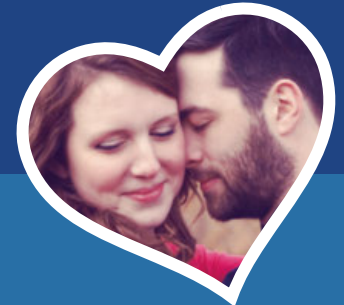
