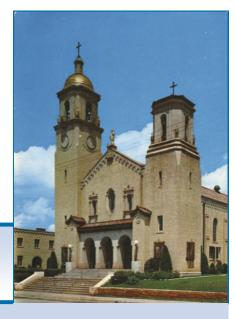
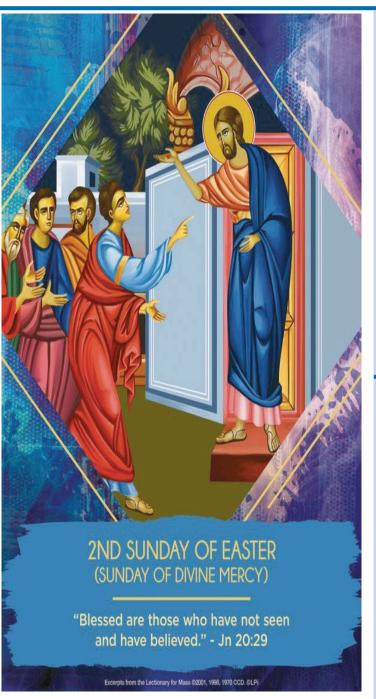

#### Pastor's Word

#### The Divine Mercy Message and Devotion

St. Faustina received extraordinary revelations in the 1930's, which she recorded in her dairy. Our Lord told her, "In the Old Covenant I sent prophets wielding thunderbolts to My people. Today I am sending you with My mercy to the people of the whole world. I do not want to punish aching mankind, But I desire to heal it, pressing it to My Merciful Heart" (Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, 1588).

Jesus chose her for the mission of bringing His message of Mercy to the world, and He called Divine Mercy Sunday mankind's "last hope of salvation" (995).

The message of the Divine Mercy is that "God loves us—all of us", and His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus will all come to share His joy.

The Divine Mercy message is simply ABC:

- **A-** Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.
- **B-** Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.
- C- Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that all graces of His mercy can only be received by our trust. The more we open the door of our hearts and lives to Him with trust, the more we can receive.

Though St. Faustina, Jesus has given us new channels for the outpouring of His grace as: the *Image of The Divine Mercy*, the *Feast of Mercy Sunday*, the *Chaplet*, the *Novena to the Divine Mercy*, and prayer at 3 o'clock in the afternoon, *the Hour of great Mercy* which will proclaim the timeless message of God's merciful love.

#### **Nurse's Corner**

#### **Coronary Heart Disease Can lead to Heart Attack**

In coronary heart disease there is a thickening of the arteries that surround the heart and nourish the heart muscle. Eventually the arteries become blocked, preventing oxygen and nutrients from getting to a portion of the heart muscle. High levels of cholesterol, (a fat-like substance), in the blood results in a build-up in the arteries causing blockage. If the heart muscle fails to receive oxygen and nutrients, that portion of the muscle dies causing a heart attack.

There a several risk factors for heart disease, many of which can be changed. Those risk factors that cannot be changed are age, gender, family history and race. People over 40 are at greater risk for heart disease. Heart disease is more common in males and in people with a family history of the disease. The disease is also more common in the African American population.

Those risk factors that can be controlled include obesity, elevated cholesterol levels(240 milligrams or more), high blood pressure, excessive alcohol consumption, smoking, physical inactivity, uncontrolled diabetes and stress.

Here is the Good News: You don't have to be a victim of heart disease. You can lower your risk factors, prevent heart disease and even reverse some forms of cardiovascular disease by developing a healthy lifestyle through improving your diet and establishing an exercise plan that you work consistently.

A healthy diet should consist of plenty of fruits and vegetables and foods high in fiber, low in fat, cholesterol and salt. Baked and broiled food should replace fried foods and limit intake of butter, eggs and dairy products.

Chicken, turkey and fish can be substituted for red meat and pork. Alcohol consumption should be limited to no more than one drink per day.

Begin a regular exercise program. Regardless of your age, you are never too old to exercise. Walking is a highly recommended form of exercise along with swimming and bicycling. Always talk to your doctor or health care provider before beginning any exercise program.

If you are a smoker, kick the habit. If your doctor has prescribed medication for you, take it as directed.

Remember there a steps you can take to improve your health.
