

Safe Environment

In an effort to support a safe environment, not only in our church, but in the communities where we live, work, and play, the Archdiocese of OKC adopted an online training program developed by Compass Child Protection. This program addresses five separate areas which include: Recognizing and Preventing Child Abuse; Professional Behaviors and Boundaries; Elderly Abuse; Domestic Abuse; and Human Trafficking. Each of us through personal contact, hearsay, or media coverage know of individuals who have been victimized in our communities. Through awareness and knowing how to safely report such activities, we can be proactive in improving our own quality of life in said communities.

Each year, volunteers along with church ministry and church leadership are required to complete a training session in one of these areas. The Safe Environment Facilitator is available to provide assistance to whomever is in need. Certification runs from August 1 through July 31.

Pastor's Word

The Acts of the Apostles 5:1-2,22-29, tell us how the Holy Spirit, in dwelling in the Church, helped the apostles to solve a major doctrinal problem between faith and culture.

All Jesus' followers were Jewish. Any Gentiles who wanted to become Jesus' disciples were expected first to become Jews, attending Sabbath synagogue services and keeping the 613 Torah laws. Through the grace of the Holy Spirit, the apostles decided that the gentiles could be converted to Judaism and were saved as Christians.

This decision marked a significant break of Christianity with Judaism. It put the burden of salvation on God rather than on man. In fact, it is God's love and His gift to us of Faith in Jesus that save us when we receive it and live it out. Our prayers, sacrifices or keeping of the Law are expressions of our gratitude to God.

Today, Imani Moore, Kristopher Moore, Mateo Coronel and Rosa Amelia Camacho Mora will be confirmed by the laying of hands and anointing with Chrism Oil by Archbishop Paul, "the special outpouring of the Holy Spirit as once granted to the apostles on the day of Pentecost". (CCC 1302)

Confirmation brings an increase and deepening of baptismal grace: it roots us more deeply in the divine filiation which makes us cry, "Abba Father!"; it unites us more firmly to Christ; it increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us; it renders our bond with the Church more perfect; it gives us special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross. Let us be reminded again that by Confirmation, we have received the spiritual seal, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of right judgment and courage, the spirit of knowledge and reverence, the spirit of holy fear in God's presence.

Nurse's Corner

Avoid the "Superbugs"

Superbugs are antibiotic-resistant bacteria that cause pneumonia, urinary tract infections and skin infections. Thet are just a few of the dangers people face today. According to the information from the Mayo Clinic and Centers for Disease Control, "superbugs have a unique ability to spread and share their antibiotic-resistant qualities with healthy bacteria in your body, creating the potential to cause infections if they get into the bladder, blood or other areas where these germs don't belong. When this happens, it leads to infections that are difficult, if not impossible, to treat effectively."

"Preventing the spread of antibiotic-resistant infections begins with practicing good hand-washing using soap and water or an alcohol-based hand sanitizer. Establishing healthy lifestyle habits such as eating a proper diet, getting enough exercise and maintaining good sleep patterns also can reduce the risk of illness."

Its also important to avoid overusing and misusing antibiotics, such as taking antibiotics when they're not the appropriate treatment. Antibiotics are designed to work against infections caused by bacteria, fungi and certain parasites—not infections caused by viruses. If you are prescribed an antibiotic, take the medicine only as directed and be sure to complete the full treatment course, even if you feel better after a couple of days.
