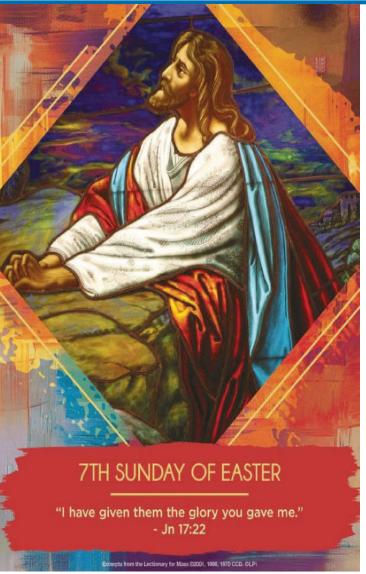

Safe Environment

In an effort to support a safe environment, not only in our church, but in the communities where we live, work, and play, the Archdiocese of OKC adopted an online training program developed by Compass Child Protection. This program addresses five separate areas which include: Recognizing and Preventing Child Abuse; Professional Behaviors and Boundaries; Elderly Abuse; Domestic Abuse; and Human Trafficking. Each of us through personal contact, hearsay, or media coverage know of individuals who have been victimized in our communities. Through awareness and knowing how to safely report such activities, we can be proactive in improving our own quality of life in said communities.

Each year, volunteers along with church ministry and church leadership are required to complete a training session in one of these areas. The Safe Environment Facilitator is available to provide assistance to whomever is in need. Certification runs from August 1 through July 31.

Pastor's Word

Today we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord Jesus in Heaven after promising his disciples the Holy Spirit as their source of Heavenly power and commanding them to bear witness to him throughout the world by their lives and preaching. But the ascended Jesus is still with us through his indwelling Holy Spirit as he has promised, "I am with you always; yes, to the end of time." Today's feast is a celebration of Jesus' final glorification after his suffering, death, and Resurrection—a glory in which we, too, hope to share.

The event of the Ascension is recorded in the first chapter of the Acts of the Apostles. First, Jesus instructed his apostles to remain in Jerusalem and wait for the baptism by the Holy Spirit so that they might become his "witnesses to the ends of the earth" by the power of the Holy Spirit. Then a cloud took Jesus from the sight of the disciples and two Heavenly messengers in white garments gave them the assurance of Jesus' "second coming" or return in glory.

Paul explains the theological meaning of Jesus' exaltation, giving us the assurance that day one, we, too, will be ascending to Heavenly Glory, provided we fulfill the mission entrusted to us by the ascending Lord.

Luke 24:46-53 describes how Jesus ascended into Heaven after giving his final blessing and missionary command to his disciples. The command was to "proclaim the Good News to the whole creation, " "to be his witnesses," and "to make disciples of all nations."

We, Christians must be proclaimers and evangelizers of the Good News, preaching with words and proclaiming with our Lives. Let us ask the guidance of the Holy Spirit, as we bear witness to Jesus by our transparent Christian lives.

We are Catholics, we have been given the Sacraments as tools to save us and others in Jesus Christ.





Nurse's Corner

Tips to avoid Getting Sick

Spring has sprung and you may start to experience a stuffy nose, sinus pressure, chills, sweats, aches and pains. No one wants to be sick, but lets face it. Colds, flu and nasty viruses are around.

There are some things you can do to help your immune system keep you healthy.

Try the following 6 tips to avoid getting sick:

- 1. Drink plenty of pure water. Not beverages made from water like tea, coffee or carbonated water, but fresh, pure water. We need water tot survive. It is the base of all our body fluids like blood and our digestive juices. Water helps our food to digest and our bodies to eliminate waste. Because tap and bottled water can be contaminated, be safe and consider purchasing a water filter that reduces chlorine, pesticides, and herbicides.
- 2. Eat healthy, fresh food. A healthy diet is important in helping your immune system fight illness. Balancing your diet is the key. Focus on fresh fruits and vegetables, lean meat, seafood, and beans.
- 3. Talk to your doctor about the benefits of taking a digestive enzyme. They allow your food to be broken down and nutrients absorbed by the body.
- 4. Consider taking a probiotic. Introducing friendly bacteria into the digestive system improves how we absorb vitamins, and nutrients so our overall immunity is increased. This is thought to support health and wellness through immune-system protection, allergy reduction and provide effective and enhanced nutrient absorption.
- 5. Use nasal irrigation. This form of nasal cleansing can clear your nasal passages, and relieve nasal dryness.
- 6. Keep your hands germ free. Handwashing is the best way to eliminate germs from your hands. But soap and water are not always readily available. The best alternative to handwashing is the use of antimicrobial hand wipes. These wipes can be used to clean all touched surfaces, and wipe your hands.
