Protect Your Health

Cold and flu seasons are here.

Proper handwashing is one of the most important things you can do to keep from becoming ill. Through frequent handwashing you can wash away germs that you get from other people, from contaminated surfaces or from animals.

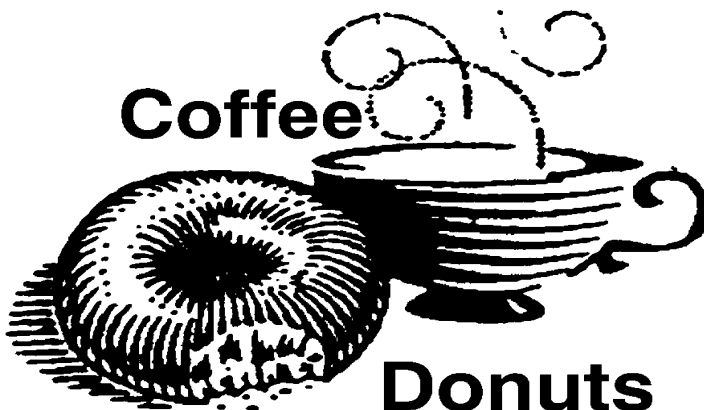
If you fail to wash your hands frequently and properly, you infect yourself when you touch your mouth, eyes, or nose. Germs can be picked up from doorknobs, pens, railings, books and other items that have been touched by people who have not washed their hands. Washing your hands with warm water and soap can reduce the chances of getting and spreading germs. The friction used when scrubbing your hands loosens the dirt and germs. The soap attaches to the germs so that the water can wash them away.

Protect your Health by remembering to **wash your hands frequently**.

Signs of a Stroke

If you think a person may be having a stroke, Think **F.A.S.T.:**

- **Face.** Ask the person to smile. Does one side of the face droop?
- **Arm.** Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?
- **Speech.** Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence. Is the speech slurred?
- **Time.** If you observe any of these signs, **call 911 immediately**. When emergency personnel arrive, tell them when you
