Notice on Security Changes During Mass

In lieu of the ever increasing assaults on our public, religious, and governmental gathering places, we are taking steps to secure our worship environment during all Sunday Masses and any Masses celebrated throughout the liturgical year.

Effectively immediately, the main doors facing the Kelly Street side will be locked after 11:05 AM and 1:05 PM and reopened at the end of Mass. Anyone arriving after this time will need to enter through the North doors on the parking lot side. Security will be posted at these doors and someone will monitor the parking. Please do not attempt to enter through the main doors after 11:05AM or 1:05 PM. We ask that you remain vigilant, and report any suspicious activity to the security that we have in place.

Pastor's Word

Through Amos, the prophet of social justice, God condemned all kinds of injustice among the people of Israel. In the reading this Sunday (Am 6:1a, 4-7), Amos lashed out at the extravagant and luxurious lifestyle of the people, unmindful of the needs of the poor in their midst. To them, he pronounced God's sentence: "Therefore, now they shall be the first to go into exile, and their wanton revelry shall be done away with."

Through the Parable about the Rich Man and Lazarus, Jesus warns us against the sin of omission. In the final judgment, the question will be on how we have responded to the commandment of love. Simply avoiding evil is not enough. We are expected to bear abundant fruits of love, kindness, mercy and generosity towards our brothers and sisters in need.

When we examine our conscience every evening, we should think our sins of commission, the sins we have done and also our failures of doing good and helping and loving others. Failing to do so is sin of omission and it is more serious.

Just avoiding sinful acts does not make us good Christians. The Gospel tells us that sin of omission can bring us down to eternal damnation. At the Last Judgment in Matthew 25, the question is not about the sins we have committed, about the good things we should have done: did we feed the hungry? Did we give drink to the thirsty, clothing to the naked and welcome to strangers? This is well illustrated in the parable this Sunday – he was condemned to hell because he did not attend to the needs of Lazarus at his gates.

The rich man in the Gospel this Sunday was blinded and enslaved by material comfort and pleasure and chose to ignore Lazarus at his gates. Let us always check ourselves, lest we become slaves to sin and worldly things without noticing it in time.

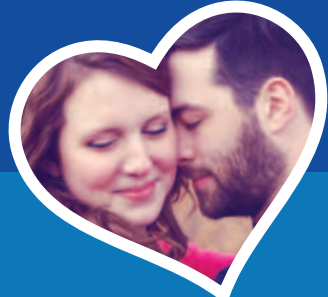
