Notice on Security Changes During Mass

In lieu of the ever increasing assaults on our public, religious and governmental gathering places, we are taking steps to secure our worship environment during all Sunday Masses and any Masses celebrated throughout the liturgical year.

Effective immediately, the main doors facing the Kelley Avenue side will be locked after 11:05 AM and 1:05 PM and reopened at the end of Mass. Anyone arriving after this time will need to enter through the North doors on the parking lot side. Security will be posted at these doors and someone will monitor the parking lots. Please do not attempt to enter through the main doors after 11:05 AM or 1:05PM.

We also ask that you remain vigilant, not put yourself or family in harms way and report any suspicious activity to the security that we will have in place.

Pastor's Word

Today, the Church celebrates the *World Mission Sunday*. I was instituted 98 years ago by Pope Pius XL. We gather to celebrate the Eucharist and to contribute to a collection for the work of evangelization around the world.

It reminds us that we are one with the Church around the world and that we are committed to carrying on the mission of Christ in different and important ways.

In his message for the 2025 World Mission Sunday, Pope Leo XIV emphasizes the theme "Missionaries of Hope Among all Peoples," encouraging us to be messengers and builders of hope in the Jubilee Year 2025. He asks us to burn with holy zeal for a new era of evangelization, bringing hope to a world overshadowed by dark shadows, and to be a community of hope by letting the Spirit guide their actions.

The Church is "missionary" in her very nature because her founder, Jesus Christ, was the first missionary. God the Father sent God . Incarnate in Jesus, His Christ, into the world with a message of God's love and salvation. The evangelizing mission of the Church is essentially the announcement of God's love, mercy, and forgiveness, and salvation, as these are revealed to mankind through the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ Our Lord.

Let us evangelize by; 1) living an exemplary and transparent Christian life, a life filled with love, mercy, kindness, compassion, and a spirit of forgiveness, and service 2) prayer as Jesus said: "*Without Me you can do nothing.*" Prayer is necessary for anyone who wishes to accept Jesus as Lord and Savior, and 3) by financial support for the missionary efforts because the love of God can often be explained to the poor only by providing them with food, medicine, and a means of livelihood.

Hence, on this Mission Sunday, let us appreciate our missionary obligation and support the Church's missionary obligation and support the Church's missionary activities by leading transparent Christian lives, by fervent prayers, and by generous donations.

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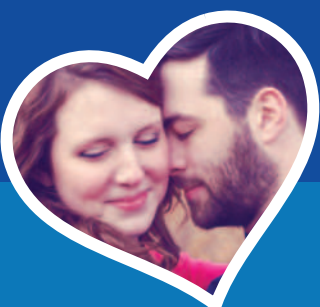
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
