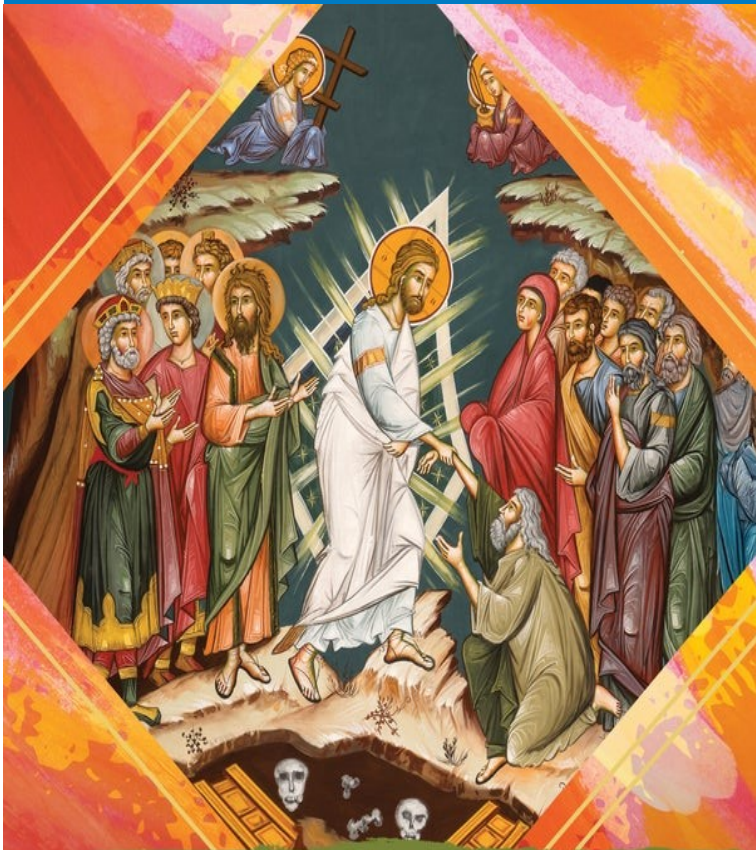

Pastor's Word

The **communion of saints** is the spiritual union of the members of the Church, living and the dead. They are all part of the single “mystical body”, with Christ as the head, in which each member contributes to the good of all and shares in the welfare of all.

Yesterday, we commemorated all saints: canonized as well as the multitude of those who are in heaven enjoying the beatific vision that are only known to God alone.

We all have the “universal call to holiness.” To join the company of the saints in heaven, we need to follow in Jesus’ footsteps and confirm ourselves to his image seeking the will of the Father in all things. We must devote ourselves with all our being to the glory of God and the service of our neighbor. (Cf. Lumen Gentium, 40).

Today, we celebrate All Souls’ Day which is set aside for honoring and praying for the dead. Unlike All Saint’ Day which celebrates those souls that are already in heaven, All Souls’ Day is a time of prayer for our departed who may be undergoing their final purification in preparation to see God face-to-face.

If we die in a state of grace, free from mortal sin, we are destined for heaven. The Scriptures says “nothing unclean can enter heaven” (Rev 21:27). Sometimes when we die, we may not completely be clean from our attachments of the world. We may need God to perform a final scrubbing. This is the work of Jesus’s cross. The final state of purification, being refined by the “fire” of God’s love, is “Purgatory.”

As Catholics we pray for our departed loved ones and offer Masses for them that the grace of Christ’s cross may deliver them from any final attachments they might have had and bring them, unstained, into the glory of heaven. ‘May all the souls of the faithful, through the mercy of God, rest in peace! Amen.

Duties for a Sacristan involve taking care of the Sacristy and the sacred items within it. This includes arranging the liturgical books, vestments and other items necessary for the celebration of Mass. This is a serious ministry and must be undertaken with care and wisdom.

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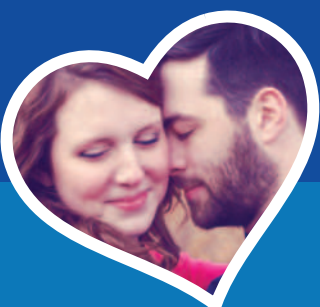
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
