



Pastor's Word

The season of **Advent** begins today. "Advent " means "coming", ("ad"-towards + "venire" - to come). Strictly speaking, Advent is the coming of Christ.

There are three comings of Jesus; his first being Christmas—his birth in Bethlehem, his second coming in the here and now, especially in the sacraments and the "signs of the times", His third coming is the "Parousia" as Judge of the living and the dead which could take place at any time.

Our preparation for Christmas should be spiritual—our soul and our relationship with God. Acts of penance, sacrifices and almsgiving will make Christmas meaningful.

"Pilgrims of Hope" for the Jubilee Year 2025, aligns perfectly with the hope and journey of Advent. **Isaiah 2: 1-5** speak of nations coming to the mountain of the Lord to learn his ways, leading to peace.

Matthew 24: 37-44 warns us to "stay awake" because we do not know the day or the hour of his return and call us for "constant vigilance and preparedness, not to be caught unaware like the days of Noah.

The Journey of Hope encourages us to fan the flame of hope. Advent is a spiritual journey where we look forward with a "trusting heart" and a "far-sighted vision". We must be people of light.

We must "put on the Lord Jesus Christ" by actively rolling back the darkness in our lives through acts of love, kindness, and peace. Let us be conscientiously clothed ourselves with our Lord, living in a way that reflects his light. The result of walking in the Lord's light is peace on earth. We pray for this peace in our hearts and world as we await the Prince of Peace.

Advent is not just a time of passive waiting, but an active preparation. Let us resolve to run to meet Christ with righteous deeds.
