Pastor's Word

Salvation is God's doing, and we cannot earn His blessings. We are saved but His grace. But we must cooperate with God's grace because God cannot force his bounty upon us without invalidating our free will.

God chose to reform the lives of His Chosen People who were wavering in their loyalty to Yahweh due to the bad example of the unfaithful successors of King David by sending the Messiah. Hence, God promised to dispel their fears and to stir up *hope* by promising of a new Davidic King (a son of Jesse), who will establish peace and a glorious Kingdom of Justice on earth.

Paul is instructing the Jewish Christians of Rome to draw endurance and encouragement from the Old Testament. They must live in harmony with Gentile Christians, accepting them as equal, brothers and sisters, while they wait together for the second coming of Jesus.

John the Baptizer urges the Pharisees and Sadducees to reform their lives, recognize and be ready to meet and accept the promised Messiah by challenging them to repentance, conversion, and renewal. He tells the common people, who expect the Messiah to come soon, to act with justice and charity, letting their lives reflect the transformation that will occur when the Messiah enters their lives. In the same way, as we prepare to welcome Christ at Christmas, John advises us "*to prepare the way of the Lord.*"

Let us prepare for Christ's coming by allowing him to be reborn daily in our lives: by repenting of our sins and renewing our lives through prayer, penance and the sharing of our blessings with others. Let us heed what Angelus Silesius said: "*Christ could be born a thousand times in Bethlehem—but all in vain until He is born in me.*"


