### Weekly Reflection from Fr. Pau

Beloved in Christ, we thank God for having made us welcome the third Week in Ordinary Time. Let us embrace the Grace of God!

Jesus' teaching was of much greater significance than his miracles. His teaching took precedence even over preaching the Gospel of the Kingdom.

Christ has brought us from darkness of sin into the Light of God ( Mt 4: 16 ) by calling us to repentance ( Mt 4: 17 ) and complete acceptance of the Kingdom of God and God's consequent rule over us.

Paul calls the Christians to rise above the immature rivalries and to follow the humility and obedience of Jesus who emptied himself for them all. People who live in the Light must overcome divisions and rivalries. The quarrel and division among them show that they are **not** living in the light of Christ, for Christ cannot be divided. So, Paul urges his readers to heal all divisions in their community so they will be able to bear united witness to the Lord and , above all, to keep their focus on Jesus Christ.

In today's Gospel passage (Mt 4:12-23), Matthew explains that what Isaiah prophesied has been fulfilled through the preaching and healing ministry of Jesus. By his ministry of inviting people to the Kingdom of God through repentance, Jesus has brought Light to peoples living in darkness, thus fulfilling God's original promise.

Jesus began his ministry among the small and insignificant places and people telling them, "*Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven has come near.*" Jesus is asking not just to be sorry for some wrong actions we have done in the past but for a **change of direction** from now on and into the future, a right-about-turn from sin to God. Let us invite God to do for us what we can't do for ourselves to change and re-create us. "*Repent*" is in the present tense "*Keep on renting!*"

Repentance is the ongoing lifestyle of the people in the Kingdom.

**Lent is just around the corner and we will prepare  
for it with a Penance Service on Wednesday, March  
11th. Mark your calendars and we hope you will  
plan to participate in the sacrament of reconcilia-  
tion**


