

Weekly Reflection from Fr. Pau

When we have spiritual thirst, the living water truly satisfies us.

Jesus encounters the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well. Tired from his journey, Jesus sits by the well, asking her who comes to draw water for a drink.

By asking for a drink from her, Jesus is there to offer the living water that will quench thirst forever and become a spring of water leading to eternal life. The woman asks for this water. By revealing her entire life, Jesus helps her to recognize him as a prophet.

Jesus reveals his identity by stating, "I am he." The woman becomes an evangelist, leaving her water jar behind and bringing her entire town to meet Jesus. Many Samaritans believe in him, first because of her testimony and then because they encounter Jesus themselves and recognize him as the Savior of the world.

Jesus offers the Samaritan woman—and, through her, an entire community—living water that satisfies eternally. This water is not drawn from Jacob's well but flows from Jesus himself, the source of eternal life.

The woman's testimony reminds us that encountering Christ transforms us into witnesses who invite others to "come and see." As we continue our Lenten journey, we invited to acknowledge our spiritual thirst and recognize that only God can truly satisfy it.

The Israelites experience physical thirst in the wilderness and begin to question whether God is really with them.

We are encouraged to drink deeply from the living water that Christ offers. The question posed at Massah and Meribah remains: "Is the Lord among us or not?" The answer comes in Jesus, who crosses every boundary to offer us life-giving water and calls us to worship in spirit and truth.
