

## Weekly Reflection from Fr. Pau

Death and resurrection are the themes that permeate today's Scripture.

The release of the Jews from the captivity and slavery of Babylon is described as a rising from their graves to return to a new life in their homeland. Through the prophet, God assures the exiles that they will live again and experience new life that springs from God's own Spirit. Ezekiel urges us to look beyond the catastrophe to a future that vindicates God's justice and promises the restoration of the nation through the Spirit of God.

In a way, the prophecy was fulfilled in the story of Lazarus. Jesus raised Lazarus to life again four days after his death. This demonstrates Jesus' own coming Resurrection on the third day after his death on the cross. Through this great miracle, the Church assures us that we, too, will be raised into eternal life after our battle with sin and death in this world.

This miracle took place that "*for God's glory. So that the Son of God may be glorified through it.*" When Jesus brings Lazarus back to life, people will give God glory for the miracle. Jesus' glorification involves the cross, and Lazarus' raising will lead to Jesus' death and Resurrection. This is another way of saying that Jesus' death on the cross will lead to his glorification.

When Martha told Mary that Jesus wanted to talk with her, Mary went immediately, surrounded by her friends, to find Jesus. "*Jesus wept.*" Jesus was the Son of God and the Son of Man, fully human, sharing our grief and comforting us. Mary's friends who grieved with her are the model of a supporting Church community. The Church must be a community offering compassion and consolation to one another.

Archbishop Coakley asks that we "pray for reconciliation where there is division, for justice where there are violations of fundamental rights and for consolation for all who feel overwhelmed by fear or loss." Please plan to join us, for all or part of the Holy Hour. The full statement from Archbishop Coakley is in the Sooner Catholic dated February 8, 2026.
