Notice on Security Changes During Mass

In lieu of the ever increasing assaults on our public, religious, and governmental gathering places, we are taking steps to secure our worship environment during all Sunday Masses and any Masses celebrated throughout the liturgical year.

Effectively immediately, the main doors facing the Kelly Street side will be locked after 11:05 AM and 1:05 PM

and reopened at the end of Mass. Anyone arriving after this time will need to enter through the North doors on the parking lot side. Security will be posted at these doors

Pastor's Word

While Moses was on Mount Sinai talking to the Lord, the Lord was angry because many Israelites who spoke against the Lord and acted perversely. They had casted for themselves an image of a calf, worshipped it and sacrificed to it, giving credit to the idol for bringing them out of slavery in the land of Egypt.

Greatly offended by the people for having turned away from the way that He had commanded them, The Lord sent fiery serpents which killed many Israelites. The Lord relented when they implored to have mercy on them and for forgiveness. God changed His mind and decided not to destroy the people as He had originally planned. Moses was instructed to make a symbolic serpent attached at the end of the pole and declared that whoever is bitten need only to look at the serpent and they will be healed.

In Ex 32:7, when God first spoke to Moses about the perversion of the people, referring to them as “your people,” and no longer as “My people.” God detaches Himself away from those who renounce Him, especially when the credit for manifestation of Divine power is given to false gods.

Powerful is the intercession of those who live righteously on behalf of those who are unrighteous. It is the intercession of the righteous that draws the mercy of God.

Moses, a sinner himself, mediated for the sinful people. Now, we have “one Mediator between God and humankind, Christ Jesus, Himself human, who gave Himself a ransom for all.” (1 Tim. 2:5-6)

Jesus, the Son of Man, will be raised (on the cross) and will be the source of life eternal for those who will believe. For Christians, the cross is a sign of inhumanity by man, humanity of God, love, sacrifice, justice, and obedience.

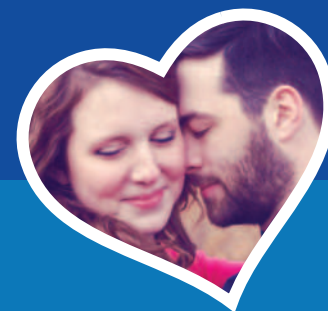

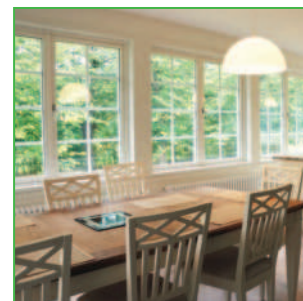
