FR. CHRISTOPHER'S CONTEMPLATION

Happy Sunday!

With the business of our culture, social media, and the constant barrage of opinions, it can be very difficult to determine what is right and true. The saturation of information does not make it any easier to determine what is fact from fiction. Therefore, it is important we pay close attention to the source of the information. In the tenth chapter of the Gospel of John, Jesus has an encounter with some of the Jews in Jerusalem. They ask Jesus, "if you are the Christ, tell us plainly." Jesus answered them, "I told you, and you do not believe." The Jews are asking Jesus to make it plain for them, but He already has and they refuse to listen. He has told them that He is the bread come down from heaven, He is the Good Shepherd, He has healed the blind man, and has walked on water and still they do not believe. They do not believe, therefore they do not belong to His flock.

Jesus explains in John's Gospel, "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them and they follow me." The sheep that belong to Christ the Good Shepherd are those who hear His voice, who know Him and who follow Him. This is how we know who belongs to his flock. Like the Jews in the previous passage who heard the voice of Christ and ignored it, so we too can do the same. We can hear the voice of Jesus in the scriptures, at Mass, and in our prayer and ignore it. We can allow ourselves to listen to all of the other noise instead of listening to the truth of Christ. If we allow this to happen then we become lost sheep of Christ. It is in how we live our lives that determines to whose voice we listen, to what flock we belong, and to who our shepherd is. This choice is up to us; do we belong to the flock of Christ or not?

If we do belong to His flock, then we rest in the assurance of what He has promised us; "my sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish. No one can take them out of my hands." As sheep of Christ, we have been placed in the hands of the Father by the Son and eternal life has been given to us and this cannot be taken away by anyone. Therefore, let us strive each and every day to live up to our name as disciples of Christ. To remain in His flock as the sheep who hear His voice, who remain with Him, and who follow wherever He leads.

NATIONAL CATHOLIC YOUTH CONFERENCE DONATIONS NEEDED

Students from Our Lady of the Lakes are planning to attend the National Catholic Youth Conference (NCYC). The conference is held in Indianapolis, Indiana at Lucas Oil Stadium on November 21-24, 2019. This is an exciting, biannual four-day experience of prayer, community, and empowerment for catholic teenagers and adult chaperones. The schedule includes general sessions addressing a wide variety of topics including forgiveness, Catholic spirituality and prayer, global issues, sexuality, and leadership. NCYC invites participants to encounter Christ, experience church and be empowered for discipleship.

The cost for the conference is \$465 per student. Our Lady of the Lakes students attended the conference for the first time two years ago, so we are again attempting to register a good core of students who will experience NCYC and bring back their experience to their classmates. Archbishop Vigneron's post-synod pastoral letter "Unleash the Gospel" challenges our school and parish to undergo a "missionary conversion" and a need for a "new evangelization". The NCYC will offer our students an opportunity for evangelization. Many of our students hope to attend but cannot financially afford it without assistance. Also, keep us in prayer as we prepare for NCYC. We are hoping to join 25,000 teens who will attend this year.

Three Laker students entered into the Catholic Church during the Easter Vigil this Easter season, each with their own faith journeys inspired by their short time spent at Our Lady of the Lakes Catholic School.

The Campbells, Steve and Tammy with sons Chase (Grade 8) and Zachariah (Grade 3), were referred to Our Lady of the Lakes Catholic School by a current Laker family they played with on a local baseball team. The boys' grandfather, a product of Catholic school and longtime Mass-goer at OLL, was also a driving force to enroll them for the 2018-19 school year.

Upon joining the Laker family, the Campbells began attending Mass regularly on Sunday at the parish with their grandfather. Steve and Tammy had been born and raised in the Christian faith but were just beginning their exploration of Catholicism.

"We really were intrigued by the history of the Catholic Church. The dedication of the priests, workers, and members of the community and the parish," said Tammy.

This year, the Campbells chose to make the Easter Vigil a family affair, and the four registered with the parish and signed up to complete the Catholic faith formation program Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), a process in which those seeking to grow in an understanding of the Roman Catholic faith come together to explore Catholic beliefs.

RCIA classes met weekly starting in the fall and continuing through the end of the Easter season, culminating by being welcomed into the Church or into full communion at the Great Vigil of Easter.

"The RCIA classes were very informative in both the Bible and the history and structure of the church," Tammy explained.

Our third student who became a neophyte of the Catholic Church was eighth-grader Luke Clason. Luke enrolled at Our Lady of the Lakes Catholic School last year as a seventh grader. After a year of taking religion classes, he discovered his desire to be baptized and fully participate in Mass with the rest of his classmates.

While his eighth-grade peers prepared for Confirmation, Luke registered for RCIA. He joined twelve others, including classmate Chase and his family, at the Easter Vigil, where he received all three Sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

A “shepherding” theme links today’s Scripture passages. In the Acts of the Apostles, Paul and Barnabas speak to the Jewish converts to Christ. A week later, they are persecuted for preaching again in Antioch — they turn to shepherd the Gentiles instead. In the Book of Revelation, the evangelist St. John wonderfully describes those who have persevered through great tribulation for the faith: *For the Lamb who is in the center of the throne will shepherd them and lead them to springs of life-giving water.* In St. John’s Gospel, Jesus proclaims: *My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me.* Sheep do indeed learn their shepherd’s voice and follow them. As the Good Shepherd, Jesus continues to knock on the door of our hearts, inviting us to a deeper relationship with Him. Are we prepared to follow Christ, to accept His challenge of discipleship, whatever the cost, as we strive for eternal life? Consider encountering our Lord through Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction.



DIVINE MERCY

Then I saw the Lord Jesus nailed to the cross. When He had hung on it for a while, I saw a multitude of souls crucified like Him. Then I saw a second multitude of souls, and a third. The second multitude were not nailed to their crosses, but were holding them firmly in their hands. The third were neither nailed to their crosses nor holding them firmly in their hands, but were dragging their crosses behind them and were discontent. Jesus then said to me: Do you see these souls? Those who are like me in the pain and contempt they suffer will be like Me also in glory. And those who resemble Me less in pain and contempt will also bear less resemblance to Me in glory.
