## FR. CHRISTOPHER'S CONTEMPLATION

Happy Sunday,

As many of you know, this weekend, at all of the Masses we have been fortunate enough to have with us a relic of Blessed Fr. Solanus Casey. Bl. Solanus was a Capuchin priest who served the people of Detroit at St. Bonaventure Capuchin Monastery. Bl. Solanus was a simplex priest, which meant that he could not say Mass publicly, he could not preach and, he could not hear confessions. He was the porter at the monastery. He would answer the door when people would knock. He was not an academic and studies were difficult for him, but he served God and His people with great love and devotion by meeting with people when they would come to the monastery. He would pray with them, encourage them and many were healed by him. People would come from all around to visit him, seek his intercession and pray for healing with him.

Bl. Solanus is a great model for us in Detroit of holiness. He is currently in the process of canonization to the Sainthood. Solanus was declared venerable in 1995 by Pope John Paul II. Being declared Venerable, is one of the early steps in becoming a canonized Saint in the Catholic Church. Pope Francis announced that venerable Solanus would be beatified, the next step toward canonization. The beatification took place at Ford Field on November 18th, 2017. After the beatification, Solanus was given the title of Blessed, which means that he can now be venerated in our local region, be included in the litany of the saints (though he is not a saint yet) and his relics can now be used for public devotion. He is on his way to sainthood and awaits the verification of a second miracle. At that point, he will be canonized a Saint and will be venerated by the universal Church.

It has been a great grace for our community to have one of Bl. Solanus's relics with us this weekend. We have a bone from his hand, which is a first class relic. There are three classes of relics: the body or part of it, something that belonged to or was worn by the Saint, and something that has touched a first-class relic. The practice of venerating and praying with relics is an ancient tradition tracing back to saying Mass on the tombs of the martyrs. Like with Mary and the other Saints, we do not worship them or their relics, rather we use the relics to help us pray to the saints to whom they belonged. We ask the Saints to intercede for us to God as they have already walked the journey of faith and have made it to the kingdom of heaven.

I encourage all of you if you have never been to the Solanus Casey Center at St. Bonaventure, to go visit. Bl. Solanus is buried there and it is a great place to learn more about his life, to pray and to seek his intercession. Let us pray often to the Saints that they may guide us ever closer to Christ so that we may serve Jesus with deeper devotion and love.

## CATHEDRAL CULTURAL SERIES


