Thoughts from Fr. Scott

Thursday brought the beginning of a new school year. Welcome back to all of our faculty and students. This year we welcome new teachers to our staff and our administrative team returns to lead our students in the ways of knowledge, faith, and hope. I am most grateful to our entire team for accepting the challenge to lead and educate our students. The students are, as you might expect, ranging in attitude from very excited to begin, to I can't believe summer is over already, much like every other school in the world. Still, it is great to have everyone back on campus and growing in knowledge of the Lord and our Catholic faith. This is simply the very best time of the year for us at the parish. I am anxiously looking forward to a wonderful year of learning and teaching. So, welcome back everyone, I have missed having you here on a daily basis.

In addition to our school year beginning, we are registering children for our faith formation programs. These programs are specifically designed to foster spiritual growth in the hearts of our young. Our family catechesis program will be taking place once a month on Sunday afternoons. This program helps facilitate our busy families to learn our Catholic faith. Our regular Monday night educational program will be offered again this year as well as our Sunday school for the little ones. Please consult the bulletin and contact the faith formation office to register your children if you are interested in any of these programs. This time of year brings the beginning of many programs. We hope to be as prepared as possible to receive everyone with great hope and joy but need your help by registering for the many different programs. Please let us know of your intentions as soon as possible.

Soon we will be starting up our RCIA group for the year. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which we receive people formally into our Catholic Church. Folks who want to become Catholic from another faith or Catholics needing to complete full initiation in the Church, through Confirmation or First Eucharist, are encouraged to join the RCIA and learn about the faith. Any adult seeking to be received into the Church should contact us to fill out the paperwork and receive further information. A number of people have already expressed an interest in the group for the coming year. An invitation is being extended to any and all who wish to formally become a member of the Catholic Church. Through this process we learn about the major tenets of our faith in inspiring and well-founded ways. If you are interested, or know someone who is, I encourage you to contact the parish office and we can discuss it from there.

On Saturday, September 7, 2019 we will be changing our regular Saturday liturgy schedule. **Beginning on Saturday, September 7, 2019 and going forward, confessions will begin at 3:30 p.m. and Mass will begin at 5:00 p.m.** as announced last weekend. This is an important change for our community and the decision was very carefully and prayerfully considered. The worship commission, staff and majority of parishioners consulted asked for this change to our weekend schedule. The time seemed right to make the change after Labor Day. So, once again, beginning on Saturday, September 7, the Saturday after Labor Day, confessions will be at 3:30 p.m. and Mass be at 5:00 p.m. Thank you for making a note of the change.

This week our Lord instructs us to strive for perfection in our spiritual lives. His wording: "strive to enter through the narrow gate." Clearly, the Lord would like us to aim high. Unfortunately, we often aim too low in many areas of our spiritual and moral lives. Of course, by keeping our personal expectations low, it seems as if we are accomplishing a great deal. However, by acting in this way we too often sell ourselves short and do not realize our greatest potential. The only way to realize our greatest potential is to aim for the greatest spiritual gifts. Therefore, the Lord asks us to strive for grand expectations; meaning spiritual perfection.

FR. CHRISTOPHER'S CONTEMPLATION

Hello and happy Sunday.

I hope all of you are having a great week. Last week in my article I spoke about the importance of Faith and how it is both a gift from God and a human act, an act of the will. It is a gift from God, but also a choice. We must choose each and every day to be Christ's disciples and to live as such; to come to know and learn our faith, to be rooted in the Word of God, the scriptures, and to take a leap of faith to follow where Jesus leads us.

Many people today believe that they do not need faith, religion, or to go to Church as long as they are good people. Others just go through the motions and pick and choose what they want to believe and what doctrines they choose to keep. This is not what Jesus teaches. Nowhere in the bible does Jesus say "go and be good people", "just try to keep some of the commandments", "just try your best and you can make it to heaven." No. Jesus never says any of this. Rather, He tells us to keep all the commandments. He tells us that he is sending us out like lambs among wolves, that the Christian life is going to be difficult, it will not be easy, but He is sending the Holy Spirit to guide us. He tells us that the reward is great for those who follow Him.

In response to all that Jesus has given us and revealed to us, we have one of two choices: Jesus is who he says He is or He is the biggest liar and fraud in all of human history. As I mentioned earlier, many people want to pick and choose which doctrines they want to believe, to which parts of the bible they will adhere to, and to which teachings of Christ they will keep, but this is not an option for faith and discipleship. Jesus is the Son of God and we need to follow everything He teaches us or we should believe none of it. I think you know where I fall.


