

FR. CHRISTOPHER'S CONTEMPLATION

Hello and happy Sunday,

I hope everyone had a great week. Over the last few weeks here in my article we have been looking at virtues; living a life of virtue, cultivating the cardinal virtues and this week we will conclude our look at the virtues with the theological virtues of faith, hope, and love. As we have been discussing, all virtue is grounded in the cardinal virtues of prudence, justice, fortitude, and temperance. It is in the theological virtues of faith, hope, and love that we relate all virtue to God and strive to live in a relationship with the Most Holy Trinity from whom the Theological virtues find their origin, motive, and object (ccc 1812). They have been infused into our soul by God and stand as the foundation of our moral activity which makes it possible for us to live as children of God (ccc 1813) and have been infused into our soul by God to make it possible for us to live as children of God.

The first theological virtue we will look at is faith. It is by faith that we come to believe in God, in all that He has revealed to us through the Holy Spirit, Christ and His Church. Faith helps us to commit ourselves, our very lives to loving and serving God who is truth itself by helping us to come to know His will. As Christ's disciples, it is not enough to know the faith, but rather we must also proclaim it boldly and help to spread it to others with love.

This brings us to the virtue of hope, which strengthens our desire for the kingdom of God, heaven. It is hope that helps us to not rely "on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit (ccc 1817)." It is the joy of hope that fills us with happiness, prevents discouragement, and sustains us in the difficulties of life as we strive daily to order our activities toward the service of God as we await the kingdom of God.

The third and final theological virtue is love (charity). It is in this virtue that we come to love God above all else and to love our neighbors as ourselves, for Jesus established love as His new commandments, to love others as I have loved you. The virtue of love helps us to imitate the love of Christ and the love the Father has for us as His children. As we know, God is love and we are to live out His example of love in our thoughts and actions. This virtue helps us to love our enemies, to love those who persecute us, who irritate us, to love the poor, our neighbors, our families, and our friends with the great self-sacrificing love of Christ. It is important to remember that "Charity upholds and purifies our human ability to love, and raises it to the supernatural perfection of divine love (ccc 1827)."

The three theological virtues of faith, hope and love have been given to us as a great gift from God to assist us on our Christian journey as disciples. They draw us ever closer to the most holy Trinity and stand as our model for life in Christ. Jesus and the saints have given us great examples of how to live each day according to these virtues. To live in the faith of the knowledge of God and his kingdom. To foster hope of the kingdom in the moments of struggle and challenge, and

to share the love God has for us with those we encounter each and every day. As disciples we are to be the face of Christ for the world. Therefore let us commit ourselves to be rooted in the virtues; to live virtuous lives rooted in the cardinal and theological virtues that by our example of faith, hope and love, others too might come to know Christ, to love Him and serve Him as His disciples.



TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In today's First Reading from the Book of the Prophet Amos, he sternly admonishes the unlawful that God will discipline those who trample upon the needy and destroy the poor of the land! In St. Luke's Gospel, a foundational principle emerges on the topic of riches: one cannot serve both God and money. Wealth itself is not necessarily bad when used wisely. Christian stewards recognize that all gifts of treasure are God-given and, out of gratitude, give back generously a portion of these blessings to God and to those in need. Many commentators suggest sacrificing 5 percent of their gross annual income to the weekly parish offertory, 1 percent to the Catholic Services Appeal, and 4 percent to other charitable Christian causes. Generosity can atone for a multitude of sins as God looks kindly on a generous giver. Today's worldly culture reveres money and wealth. Who will you choose to serve — God or mammon?
