Reflection and prayer that leads one to active faith are exactly what the Lord wants of us as His body in the world. FR. CHRISTOPHER'S CONTEMPLATIONS

Hello and happy Gaudete Sunday!

I pray everyone is doing well on this third Sunday of Advent. If you are confused by my greeting, let me explain. The third Sunday of Advent is also known as Gaudete Sunday. The word "Gaudete" means to rejoice. As we have been journeying through this Advent season, a season of anticipation, repentance, and preparation, we light the purple candles of the Advent wreath. This weekend we light the pink or rose colored candle. The priest also wears a rose colored vestment to signify the anticipation of our joy at the coming of the Lord at Christmas as we are 3/4 the way through our Advent journey.

The pink candle of the Advent wreath, the rose colored vestments and our readings this weekend all encourage us to rejoice. As we reflect on these beautiful readings and symbols, we might find it hard in our lives right now to rejoice. It can seem like there is nothing to rejoice over. It is no surprise to anyone that 2020 has been a difficult year for many of us and it is good that we acknowledge the struggle it has been. It is good for us to be aware of those moments when we have found it difficult to rejoice, been frustrated, and angry. I encourage us to present these moments to the Lord this week in our prayer in order that we might not hold onto these feelings, experiences and irritations, but rather turn them over to the Lord. We present them to Him as a gift. Remember, only God wants our frustrations as a gift. It can be important to remember that God has not abandoned us in the struggles of life even though we do not always

experience His closeness. He is with us in the journey and has sent us the Holy spirit.

Our scripture readings provide us this weekend with encouraging words: "I rejoice heartily in the Lord, in my God is the joy of my soul", "rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Jesus Christ." I encourage us in those moments when we sense discouragement settling in let us call to mind these words from Isaiah and St. Paul. The Lord is the joy of our souls and will provide His joy to us in the midst of the struggles of life. Sometimes these joys are on the surface and easy to see and at other times they can be a little more difficult to see, but they are still there. St. Paul encourages us to rejoice always and pray without ceasing. I think this is where the key lies. We must be a people who pray without ceasing. To pray through the joy, through the frustration, through the anger, the uncertainty. That we might always be in prayer, to offer prayers of thanksgiving to the Lord for the blessings of our lives. There are blessings in our lives now, there is God's joy. If we are having a hard time seeing the joy and blessings, pray that God might help you to see them. Like with Mary, let us strive to allow our souls to proclaim the greatness of the Lord. to have our spirits rejoice in God our savior.

I pray that all of us this week might experience the joy of the Lord as we continue to prepare ourselves for His coming. That we might entrust to him the joys and struggles of our lives in order that our souls may proclaim the greatness of the Lord.

A Pastoral Note on Families of Parishes



The eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them.

After all the teachings of Jesus and all his miracles, including his triumphant victory over sin and death on the Cross, Jesus ascends into heaven with only eleven people standing by. This number is reduced from "the twelve" he had chosen as the foundation stones for his Church.⁴ The numbers would hardly have made a passer-by turn his head. But it is never the size, political influence, or earthly power of the disciples of Jesus by which his ministry is measured. It is measured in faithfulness. Therefore, the eleven are enough.

They are enough because they are obedient to him. Their meeting point was not randomly chosen nor was it a place where they providentially arrived. Rather, they go where "Jesus had ordered them." This small band of

disciples is obedient to Jesus. They are witnesses to the Resurrection and, while there is much they do not yet know, they obey. The Church of Christ is always marked by those who are willing to go where Jesus leads.

And Jesus leads them to a mountain. Anyone who has climbed a mountain – and Jesus had his disciples climb a number of them – knows that it is not done haphazardly. It requires effort, dedication, and purpose. Scripture often points to mountains as places where man can encounter God – and this is most perfectly exemplified by Moses' encounter with the Lord on Mount Sinai.⁶ Therefore, in obedience to Jesus, the disciples climb this mountain to encounter their last worldly glimpse of the Savior.
