THOUGHTS FROM FR. SCOTT

Hopefully your Lent is off to a wonderful and holy beginning. It is only the second week but it is never too early to ask ourselves how well we are doing in accomplishing our spiritual goals. There are many prayer opportunities being offered during Lent so as to help everyone grow in love for God and neighbor. Please take advantage of these opportunities to grow in Grace. We had a nice turn out last week for the day of Adoration, our Taize prayer and stations. Perhaps more people will join us each and every week during Lent. Please see the full Lenten schedule of events located elsewhere in the bulletin.

Last week I was named moderator of the Lakes Vicariate Family 1. This family consists of the St. Rita, St. Daniel, St. Anne in Ortonville and Our Lady of the Lakes parishes. What this means exactly and how it will be lived out is still being processed. As parish families we will be working together to further the mission of Church. This collaboration will allow us to do the work of evangelization, education and service more joyfully as the Lord commands. It also means I will reside and be the Pastor here at Lakes. Please pray for me and our entire family. I believe all good things start with prayer and are lived in the Light of Christ. The Holy Spirit will guide us in this endeavor if we trust in Him. More specifics will be forthcoming, for now I ask simply for your prayers and kind support.

Please remember those in our RCIA program, now the elect of our parish, who are preparing to receive the Sacraments at Easter. These wonderful people are making an effort to strengthen their relationship with God in a very important way. Our support for them is vital to their growth and hope in Christ. We should pray for them and everyone preparing to enter the Church by lending a kind word and prayer of encouragement. Please remember our elect in your daily prayers. There are always many people and situations needing our prayers and support; the RCIA candidates and

catechumens are among the most important.

In the main gathering area of the Church there is a poster board with information about our RCIA, Confirmation and First Eucharist candidates. Underneath the board is a basket with prayer cards of all of those who are receiving any sacrament of initiation this year. Please take a card from the basket and remember that person, by name, in your daily prayers until they receive the sacrament(s) for which they are preparing. This is a great way for us to support those who are freely choosing to enter our community of faith in a most profound manner. This board will be up and names available throughout Lent. Please make an effort to pray for all of those entering any sacramental stage of their life.

The Transfiguration is about change and the positive effect it can have in our lives. The sudden change in Jesus' appearance must have been jarring to Peter, James and John at first. Still, it was an invitation from God to see His Son in a very different light. Seeing Christ in this way, the apostles felt immediately overwhelmed and proceeded to speak before they understood. Only when they stopped to listen did they begin to see clearly and understand. The voice from the cloud helped them know the meaning and desire of God the Father. Basically, they should listen to and trust in Jesus. The transfigured glory of Jesus caused them to pause, contemplate and live. Of course, this is exactly what our plan of action should be during Lent: to pause, contemplate and live in Christ.

Hello and happy second week of Lent!

I hope the first week of Lent has been going well for everyone. If it has been a rocky start to Lent, that is ok. Do not get discouraged for today is a new day. Instead let us ask God for the grace we need to faithfully take up our Lenten observances and to be faithful to our observances this day.

Last week we began to look at the Creed and this week we will continue to examine the Creed. If we look at the Nicene Creed, we can see that it is broken into four basic parts. The first quarter of the creed focuses on the Father. The second on the Son, Jesus Christ. The third on the Holy Spirit and finally the fourth on the Church. These sections are denoted by the phrase, "I believe." These four sections express our core beliefs regarding the Trinity and the Church as a whole. As stated last week, the creed seeks to give a basic teaching on the Trinity and clarify the misteachings of the many heresies at the time of the council of Nicaea.

Last week we began to look at the first section of the Creed on the Father. Let us continue this look and take the section on the Father in its entirety: "I believe in one God, the Father, almighty, Maker of Heaven and Earth, of All things visible and invisible." We believe in one monotheistic God (one god not many, as explained last week) who is the Father of all creation and the first person of the Most Holy Trinity. Jesus often refers to God as Father in the scriptures. We know God to be a loving Father who wishes to be active within His creation. God did not set creation out in the universe and proceed to leave it alone, apart from Him. Rather God seeks to interact with us His creation. He is a relational God and Father to all creation.

The Father is almighty and the creator of all things. In philosophy we

discuss how things can not come from nothing. That they must have an origin and a mover who puts them into motion (laws of physics). This 'unmoved mover,' the source of all creation that created the cosmos and put it into motion is the Father. It is from Him that all things have their being and origin. There is nothing that the Father himself has not created and nothing can exist outside Him. Again, God the Father has made all things in the universe; the visible and the invisible.

When we speak about God as the creator of things visible and invisible, we are claiming that God has created the physical world (things visible) and that God is the creator of the invisible world (the spiritual world, including angels who are pure spirit). If we claim that God has created all things physical and the spiritual, then they must be good and have a divine purpose. It is important to remember that God does not create Junk or things without a purpose. All of God's visible and invisible creations have a purpose in His plan for salvation, even though we may not always understand their purpose. It is also important to mention here that God allows us to experience suffering, though God does not send us suffering. Again He allows it and can use it to bring about something greater within us.

As a recap, God the Father is the first member of the Trinity, the Father of creation, of all things visible (physical) and invisible (spiritual). It is most important to remember that the Father longs to have a relationship with us. As an earthly father has an active relationship with His children, so God our Father longs to have a relationship with us. I encourage us to foster a relationship with our Father in heaven, the creator of the world.

LENTEN FASTING & ABSTAINING

The church requires that all Catholic 14 years of age and older abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and the Fridays of Lent. Catholics ages 18-59 must also fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means that they may only eat 1 full meal and 2 lesser meals and not eat between meals. Using these practices, and others, we conform our hearts to the Lord in His fasting.



PRAY FOR OUR ELECT

You will find prayer cards for all those that are preparing to celebrate sacraments at Easter. Look for the prayer cards in a basket in the back of church. We ask you pray for those in RCIA during their final weeks before joining the Catholic Church.



CATHOLIC COMMUNITY RESPONSE TEAM (CCRT)

CCRT provides Christian, compassionate relief to the impoverished and disadvantaged in Oakland County. CCRT offers direct referrals and support to those in crisis situations. In addition, they try to offer assistance with immediate physical and household needs. We are collecting personal hygiene products as well as household cleaning products to assist CCRT.



HOLY REDEEMER CATHOLIC PARISH

The pantry of Holy Redeemer helps the underprivileged and disadvantaged in southwest Detroit. The church pantry offers assistance with immediate physical hygiene items to help as well as socks and gloves to support Holy Redeemer.



OPERATION RICE BOWL

Operation Rice Bowl is the official Lenten program for Catholic Relief Services.

PASTORAL CARE REGARDING THE VATICAN'S NOTE ON BAPTISM

In August of 2020, the Vatican Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith issued a response to questions regarding the use of the words, "We baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" instead of the proper form of "I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit". The Vatican ruled that the form "We baptize" does not convey the Sacrament of baptism.

In the Archdiocese of Detroit, we are aware that between 1986 - 1999, potentially invalid baptisms occurred at St. Anastasia Parish in Troy, conducted by Deacon Mark Springer using the improper form. We are in the process of contacting those individuals who may be affected and we are asking for your help.

If you or someone you know was baptized at St. Anastasia Parish during this time period or you have any questions or concerns about the validity of your sacrament(s), we invite you to visit the website aod.org/sacramentsupdate for more information and to submit questions or concerns using the online form.
