THOUGHTS FROM FR. SCOTT

As we celebrate the third Sunday of Lent, our thoughts turn more intently toward sacrifice and obedience. So, how are things going with respect to your promises and intended sacrifices this Lent? Are we preparing for Easter in the most appropriate way possible? It is important for us to check in on our promises and keep them at the front of our minds during the middle of Lent. I am very pleased to see the numbers of people turning out to deepen their prayer lives. If you have not joined us for Adoration and/or the praying of the rosary on the Tuesdays of Lent you are depriving yourself of something very beautiful and necessary. The Thursday evening Taize prayer is beneficial to all who avail themselves of the calm hour of prayer. Additionally, praying the devotion of the stations on Fridays is another great way to reflect upon His Passion and grow in love for God. Please use these opportunities for prayer to help you through Lent and life so as to be immersed in faith.

My thoughts at this time of year turn to a very special group of people in our parish. The RCIA stands for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This program is how adults seek full communion with the Church. Most people refer to those involved as "converts." Well, some are actual converts to the Catholic faith and others are not. Some folks are simply completing their initiation in the Church and others are being received into full communion. In any case, they are important for our parish community. This Sunday we begin an intense time of prayer for them and begin certain presentations of the Creed and Our Father for their reflection. After a great deal of study, they have come to a fuller knowledge of Christ and are now ready to accept the mysteries He left for us to follow. This week, we invite them to pray with us more intently and to be one with us in our proclamation of faith. So, continue to pray for these wonderful folks and when you see them encourage them in prayer.

Of course, this is not the only group of people in our parish preparing for sacramental celebrations. We have two other groups of young people preparing for First Communion and Confirmation. These young people are just beginning to understand their relationship with the Christ and realize His presence in their daily lives. They need our prayers as well. To this end, in the main gathering area of the Church there is a poster with pictures of our RCIA, Confirmation and First Eucharist candidates. Immediately in front of the poster is a basket with the names of those receiving any sacrament of initiation this year. I encourage everyone to take a name from the basket and remember that person, by name, in your daily prayers until they receive the sacrament for which they are preparing. This is a great way for us to support those who are freely choosing to enter our community of faith in a most profound manner. The poster will be up and names will be available for a while. Please make an effort to pray for all of those entering any sacramental stage of their life.

Finally, I pray and hope your Lenten journey is bringing faith alive in your heart. Lent can be a time of great change and growth. I sincerely hope everyone takes this time to repent of sin and truly appreciate growth in their spiritual lives. Yes, this Lenten season can be like all the rest and not inspire much difference in our lives. It can also be very different from all others and move us to do extraordinary things in the Lord. The difference between these two main levels of growth, or lack thereof, is our attitude and approach to Lent. The old saying is completely true: "you get out of it, what you put into it." I hope and pray everyone puts a great deal into it!

FR. CHRISTOPHER'S CONTEMPLATIONS

Hello and happy Lent!

For the past two weeks in my article, we have been looking at the Nicene Creed and have covered the first quarter dealing with God the Father. This week we will begin the second quarter of the Creed which discusses the second member of the Most Holy Trinity, the Son of God, Jesus Christ.

The creed states: *"I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ."* Jesus is the lord over all created things. A lord is someone having power, authority and influence. Jesus, however, does not use His authority for selfish gain, rather for the salvation of Humanity. The creed continues: *"The only begotten son of God. Born from the Father before all ages."* Jesus is the only Son of God who has a particularly unique relationship to the Father. What we have by adoption, being sons and daughters of God, Jesus has by His nature as Son of God. Jesus was not created by God at the time of His conception in the womb of Mary. Instead, He was Born of the Father before all ages. Before time and creation was established on Earth, the Son had existence. Jesus the Son, was born out of the essence of God the Father and therefore the Son shares the very nature of God the father. As the Father is eternal, so too is the Son.

When we speak of the relationship between the Trinity, it can get a little confusing. Jesus the Son is son

because of the relationship He has to the Father. For there to be a son there must first be a father. As we know, Jesus the Son is not the Father, but they are both God. The creed continues: *"God from God, Light from Light. True God from true God."* Jesus is not part of God. He is God as much as the Father is God and the Holy Spirit is God. The Son is distinct from the Father yet not divided from Him. God from God.

Finally, *"Begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father. Through Him all things were made."* Jesus is consubstantial to the Father, meaning that they share the same substance. They are united to one another both by substance and by will. As the creed explains further, through the Son, Jesus Christ, as the word of God, all things find their creation for through Him all things were made.

Whenever we discuss the topic of the Most Holy Trinity, we acknowledge there is a particular mystery to it. What we know of the Trinity has been revealed to us in revelation and by Jesus Himself and therefore they are not beliefs we just came up with on our own. I encourage us as we continue to look at the creed, to take some time to pray with the creed. Sit with each phrase and see what comes to mind, see what God speaks to your heart. Next week we will continue to explore the creed in relation to Jesus.

LENTEN FASTING & ABSTAINING

The church requires that all Catholic 14 years of age and older abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and the Fridays of Lent. Catholics ages 18-59 must also fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means that they may only eat 1 full meal and 2 lesser meals and not eat between meals. Using these practices, and others, we conform our hearts to the Lord in His fasting.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION DAY




