Moms have to juggle so many different responsibilities and make it work like a well-oiled machine. Yes, you are owed our gratitude and deep appreciation for simply having the courage to bear children and raise them with patience. Please know of my prayers for all of you and your families this Mother's Day. To my own mom I write: Happy Mother's Day, you are the very best and I love you very much!

Next Sunday, May 16th, we will celebrate the feast of the Ascension of the Lord. In years past, many have referred to the feast as "Ascension Thursday." Of course, it was appropriately named because the feast was always celebrated on the Thursday forty days after Easter. Years ago, the National Conference of Bishops for the United States petitioned Rome and asked that the celebration of this feast be moved to the Sunday before Pentecost. The request was granted and the feast has been transferred to the seventh Sunday of Easter. It occurs this way in many countries and different Dioceses throughout the United States. Therefore, please note: next Thursday is not a day of obligation and our celebration of the Ascension will be held on Sunday in accordance with Church law.

Next Saturday, May 15th, Deacon Bob Voiland will be ordained to the priesthood for service in the Archdiocese of Detroit. Once he becomes Fr. Bob Voiland he will be assigned to our parish as our new parochial vicar. This will be a great day for the Archdiocese and for us at Lakes. We should all keep Deacon Voiland in our thoughts and prayers this week. We are very blessed to have the Archbishop assign him to our

parish for his maiden voyage as a priest and I know he is praying for all of us. So, let us support him in our prayers and ask God to increase his holiness so that we may receive and joyful and humble priest to serve here at Our Lady of the Lakes.

Congratulations to our young people who received the Sacrament of Confirmation last Tuesday. It was a beautiful Spirit-filled event. These young men and women have great potential to impact others positively for Jesus Christ. The Mass was beautiful and Bishop Cepeda proclaimed a wonderful homily filled with joy. Mother's Day gives us an opportunity to show our mothers (biological, godmothers and spiritual mothers) how much we appreciate them and all that they have done for us. I know this day can be a joyful day and can be a sad one for many people who may have lost mom, who might not have the best relationship with their mother or for those who long to be mothers. For those to whom this day is difficult I offer my prayers.

As I was praying about Mother's Day, I could not help but to think of our patroness, Mary the Mother of God. Through our Baptism, Mary has become all of our mothers. She longs to love us, to guide us and to assist us along our journey of faith. I would like to invite all of us on this Mother's Day to take this opportunity to draw close to our Lady. Mary is the perfect model of motherhood. I would encourage all mothers to take Mary as your model and to seek her intercession to guide you in faith, love, and motherhood.


PRAYER SHAWLS



Happy Mothers' day to all that have had the blessing of children and thank you to my mom for choosing life and raising me in the light of faith.

I do not take the fact that I am a mom for granted and I pray that others do not as well.

This day I want to bring light and hope to those that are wanting to give birth and are unable to; these women (and men on Fathers' Day) are often forgotten on days like this and it is on my heart to acknowledge the questioning and pain you may have. In that vein, I began my prayer and research and I have some things that I want to share.

I found a website that is totally Catholic that does much in helping women, and their husbands, with this very real struggle: catholicinfertilityministry.com It is loaded with prayers, links to patron saints, medical resources, links to catholic resources and information and support to your family and friends.

The mission of this ministry is

- To create awareness of the common problem of infertility, both primary and secondary, and to dispel myths surrounding it;
- To teach and promote the Church's teachings on infertility, and the reasons for them;
- To provide information on treatments available that are moral and successful;
- To provide support for individuals experiencing infertility, including those undergoing treatment, going through the foster/adoption process, or dealing with or grieving the inability to have children;
- To provide support for those grieving the loss of their children through pregnancy loss, miscarriage, or still birth; and
- To help each other "radiate a fruitfulness of charity, of hospitality, and of sacrifice." (CCC 1654).

Their aim is to be a ministry for Catholic (or Catholic friendly) men & women experiencing primary infertility, secondary infertility, permanent infertility, miscarriage, stillbirth, and recurrent miscarriage.

SPONSOR A STUDENT FOR NATIONAL CATHOLIC YOUTH CONFERENCE

Students from Our Lady of the Lakes are planning to attend the National Catholic Youth Conference (NCYC). The conference is held in Indianapolis, Indiana at Lucas Oil Stadium on November 18-21, 2021. This is an exciting, biannual four-day experience of prayer, community, and empowerment for catholic teenagers and adult chaperones. The schedule includes general sessions addressing a wide variety of topics including forgiveness, Catholic spirituality and prayer, global issues, sexuality, and leadership. In a distinctly Catholic setting, NCYC invites participants to: Encounter Christ, Experience Church & Be empowered for discipleship.

The cost for the conference is \$475 per student. The next registration payment of \$250 is due by May 21st. Our Lady of the Lakes students attended the conference in 2017 & 2019, so we are again attempting to register a good core of students who will experience NCYC and bring back their experience to their classmates. Archbishop Vigneron's post-synod pastoral letter "Unleash the Gospel" challenges our school and parish to undergo a "missionary conversion" and a need for a "new evangelization". The NCYC will offer our students an opportunity for evangelization. If you would like to make a donation for the NCYC Conference, make the check out to OLL and place it in an envelope for Kathy Lewis. Many of our students hope to attend but cannot financially afford it without assistance. Also, keep us in prayer as we prepare for NCYC. We are hoping to join 10,000 teens who will attend this year.
