FR. CHRISTOPHER'S CONTEMPLATIONS

Hello and Happy Pentecost Sunday!

This weekend we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles at Pentecost. This great feast reminds us that we have received a great advocate, the Holy Spirit who guides us along our Christian journey. Over the last few years, I have grown in my knowledge of and my reliance upon the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit reminds me to pray and assists me in my daily journey of Faith.


When I think about the spiritual life, I often think about particular phrases or images that help me to conceptualize or understand it. One of these images is seeing the spiritual life as a journey; the journey of faith. Journeys have a beginning (Baptism) and an end (heaven). They are something we prepare for and plan for (catechesis, the studying and learning of our faith). They also require effort and time. They are not something we can forget about and still achieve.

During the Easter season my family and I set out on a different kind of journey. We decided to do a step challenge to help us break out in health. We broke the family into 3 teams and each week we would see which team could walk the most steps and at the Pentecost we would determine which team accomplished the most steps walked. It was interesting to follow the progress. At first the steps were not on my mind. I would trac them, but I wasn't paying attention to the number. As the weeks continued one of my brothers (on my team) started to reach out to our team and encourage us to get more steps in. This motivated me to get out and walk steps. By week six, I was striving each day to get out and get a walk in, to get my steps up and get them in. It was funny to see a witch in my mind set. I was now paying attention to the number of steps and if it was low I would go for an extra walk around the basement or neighborhood. I was saying things like I need to get my steps in or I need to go for a walk and this change in attitude motivated me to get after the steps. What also helped was knowing I wasn't alone and that others were encouraging me to get the steps in.

This past week I was driving home to see my family and I was reflecting on the step challenge and it struck me that it shared many similarities to our spiritual life and the importance of prayer. When we know we are doing something together, it is often easier to do it. It is important for us to remember that we are in this journey of faith together and we need to encourage each other. My brother wasn't demanding that I get my steps in, but rather encouraged me and asked how it was going. We should do the same with prayer. We need to encourage each other to pray daily, to make sure we are making that time to grow with Christ. The more we get in the habit of prayer the easier it is to pray. The steps helped with overall health and the prayer helps with overall spiritual and mental health. As I began to track the steps and walk more, I found I was checking in throughout the day to see where I was. I find this helpful with prayer as well. As we go through our day, are we paying attention

to how often we are praying, how often we are asking the guidance of the Holy Spirit? When we notice we are low in prayer, do we make time for it?

I want to encourage all of us to get our 'spiritual steps' in each day. Let us encourage each other to be a people of prayer. To be a people who are willing to walk with each other in the journey of faith and encourage each other to grow daily in prayer and love of neighbor. If we set out on this challenge together, we will be amazed how much we will grow as a community of faith and our closeness to Christ. May the Holy Spirit disturb your hearts this weekend. May He enliven your spirit, knowledge and love of God and help guide you along the journey of faith.





How does one meet the Holy Spirit and recognize a relationship with that Person of God? To me the Holy Spirit is movement and word put into action; the inspiration to live a life of Christ. How do we be people guided by the Holy Spirit? My relationship with the Holy Spirit is relatively new compared to my relationship with the other Persons of the Trinity. I was not accustomed to calling upon the Holy Spirit or acknowledging the ro of the Spirit in my life or in the Trinity. Over the years, the Holy Spirit has become my go to in prayer.

I propose that we must be people of truth and through that truth we can live out the gifts of the Holy Spirit. TRUTH, real truth, comes from Christ. If we are truthful to our Baptism and Confirmation, then we gain the promise of life eternal with our Lord; that is our goal right? A daunting task in my mind and one that I fail in often; but I persist.

Perhaps you can pray this with me this week:

Oh Holy Spirit, You are the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity. You are the Spirit of truth, love and holiness, proceeding from the Father and the Son, and equal to Them in all things. I adore You and love You with all my heart. Teach me to know and to seek God, by whom and for whom I was created. Fill my heart with a holy fear and a great love for Him. Give me compunction and patience, and do not let me fall into sin.

Increase faith, hope and charity in me and bring forth in me all the virtues proper to my state of life. Help me to grow in the four cardinal virtues, Your seven gifts and Your twelve fruits.

Make me a faithful follower of Jesus, an obedient child of the Church and a help to my neighbor. Give me the grace to keep the commandments and to receive the sacraments worthily. Raise me to holiness in the state of life to which You have called me, and lead me through a happy death to

everlasting life. Through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Grant me also, O Holy Spirit, Giver of all good gifts, the special favor for which I ask {name special petition}, if it be for Your honor and glory and for my wellbeing. Amen.


