## THOUGHTS FROM FR. SCOTT

**Vote No on proposal 3.** We have an obligation to accompany one another in life and especially those who feel as if they have limited options when it comes to procreation. As a Church, we have constantly supported life and those who are effected by awful human circumstances here in this world. Still, and above all, we have an obligation to God to respect His most precious gift of Life. Elsewhere in the bulletin this weekend you will find a sheet explaining some of the dangers of proposal 3. It is the most destructive and anti-life proposal ever put forward for a vote. It goes well beyond the so called “right to legal to abortion” that some claim is necessary and does away with any protections of women and children. It destroys all existing laws regarding this issue such as reflection periods and parental consent for minors among them. It compels any health professional to participate in taking a life in the womb up to and including the day of giving birth. There are no conscience objections for any health professional, or anyone else for that matter, and proposes a penalty for those who will not participate in the innocent taking of life. If voted into law it will certainly be used to silence people of faith in the public square. Simply put it is a horrible proposal and we have a spiritual, moral and human obligation to see that this proposal is not allowed to amend our constitution in the state of Michigan. Voting for or supporting this measure in any way puts our mortal souls at risk. We simply cannot in any way support the enshrining of murder into law. This very notion goes against every command of God and every duty of the faithful in Christ. Be inspired by Paul’s words to Timothy (1Timothy 6:11-16) in the second reading this weekend and “compete well for the faith” by voting NO on PROPSAL 3.

Today, Sunday, our OCIA group begins meeting. The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which we formally receive adults into our Catholic Church. Folks who want to become Catholic from another faith or Catholics needing to complete full initiation in the Church, through Confirmation or First Eucharist, are encouraged to join the OCIA and learn about

the faith. Any adult seeking to be received into the Church should contact me directly to fill out the paperwork and receive further information. A number of people have already expressed an interest in the group for the coming year. An invitation is being extended to any and all who wish to formally become a member of the Catholic Church. Through this process we learn about the major tenets of our faith in inspiring and well-founded ways. If you are interested, or know someone else who is, I encourage you to contact the parish office and we can discuss it from there.

Sunday afternoon and Monday evening our religious formation programs begin a new year of Catholic formation in Christ. It will be wonderful to have all the children back in the fold. An exciting year awaits the children and catechists. Our children are supplied with an exciting and safe environment to learn about the Lord, the Church and salvation. Our children preparing for Sacraments will greatly benefit from the new direction and vision we will employ this year. Hopefully, everyone will grow closer to God in the process. Please join me in welcoming back all of our religious formation students for a year filled with learning and spiritual growth.

Next weekend is Homecoming weekend here at Lakes, a most enjoyable time indeed. The football game will take place on Friday night and there are many activities scheduled to help us celebrate; the Thursday evening dinner is a new celebration this year. A weekend such as homecoming is always a welcome time in a parish as it brings friends and family together. Please join us next weekend for the many activities taking place especially the football game. Invite and encourage your Laker family and friends to visit as well. *Praise the Maker, it's great to be a Laker!*

Our Scriptures this weekend remind us to be people of great faith and humility. ## VOILAND'S VIEW

Have you ever said something to someone, or made a comment about somebody, and wished you could reel the words back in just as they were leaving your mouth? "Oh! I wish I wouldn't have said that!" Sometimes that feeling of regret might take a while to come, but we sense that our judgment was off the mark. A little too self-assured, we quickly evaluate an incident and hastily pronounce judgment on a person or situation. Often, that kind of hasty judgment comes from feeling that we have "been there and done that." We've got it all figured out. We have been tempted in life but have come out successful at conquering a particular weakness. A seemingly unshakable sin is not much trouble anymore. Feeling reasonably proud for avoiding such sin, we are more inclined to point it out in others, who don't have the ability to master it themselves. We might get so puffed up that we conclude that anybody of minimal intelligence should know better than to make such a dumb decision. We are "better" than them at this, and a feeling of superiority sets in. Sadly, we forget that, "there, but for the grace of God, go I."

It is genuinely good to arrive at a point in life where certain sins are not so overwhelming, where we have finally achieved the strength we need to fight off temptations that seemed impossible to fight in the past. But, has the attractiveness of that sin been overcome by the growth of *virtue* in us . . . or are we just physically *unable* to engage in it anymore! If we have come to a point of such mental or bodily decline, that committing a sin is more trouble than it is worth, we don't really have much to blow our horn about. Sure, we can take comfort in finding that there is an upside to getting older and falling apart, but we can hardly pat ourselves on the back for being so virtuous. Truth is, in lots of cases, if we were younger or in better shape, we would be right back in the thick of committing the same old sins we always did.

If we are truthful with ourselves, we realize that we are not all that great. Having bodies and minds that wear away curtails some of our bad behavior, but we can't take credit for this unavoidable blessing. This is why we should be generous and cautious when we judge the sins of others. Sheer accusation and condemnation is not helpful. Yes, we need to judge right from wrong, but hopefully with an eye to helping others out of sin.

We do this not as "experts" at clean living but as fellow travelers who face many challenges in life.

Patting ourselves on the back is more appropriate when we are able to avoid sin at a time when we are well-capable and have the opportunity to commit it. Avoiding sin at times when it would be super-easy to commit shows a real sensitivity to God. At these times, God is present and important in our lives. If God's presence is a deterrent to our sinning, it is for one of two reasons (which we find in our Act of Contrition): we are afraid of punishment for our sins; or, we have come to love God so dearly that we simply don't want to hurt him. This is the difference between imperfect and perfect contrition (sorrow) - the difference between fear and love. Both are adequate expressions of our sorrow for our sins to be forgiven by God. Yet, sorrow for having offended the One we love is infinitely better. Love is the deep level of human existence that we are called to by our Lord who loves us without limit. We touch divinity when we love in this way. Loving is totally different than fearing punishment for actions we would rather not give up.

May our judgment of others be just *and* loving, knowing that we have a Judge who knows us better than we know ourselves.


