Thought for the week: Would the world know you belong to Christ the King just by watching you live day to day?

VOILAND'S VIEW

When everything is going really well in our lives, we can get a little cocky – not so much super arrogant and offensive, but just a little too confident for our own good. If we feel like we've got the world by the tail, we tend to make hasty decisions, without giving much thought. We figure, if everything is humming along just fine, why wouldn't this or that thing that I am involved in, work out fine, as well? For young people, the tendency to think that they are pretty much invincible is naturally common. Such confidence is both a blessing and curse of youth. Young folks are far more willing to take risks than older people, who have become more wary with age. Military organizations throughout history have depended on the self-assuredness of young adults to recruit soldiers to form in the way they want, to do the things they want. Older people entering military service are much less inclined to do whatever they are told; they are not big risk-takers. But, regardless of age, the principle still applies: if things are going the way we want, we'll keep doing things how we want, without much in-depth thought. Depending upon the actual activity involved in the hasty decision-making, the consequences might turn out alright, be of minor significance, or be disastrous – if the decision was a bad one. Truth be told, though, a lot of bad decisions are made without much thought.


Social policy decisions are made in the same way as personal ones. Politicians in power make decisions which enhance and prolong their power. Voters vote to enhance their comfort and make life as easy as possible. Following the path of least resistance is the rule-of-thumb. The path of least resistance is also known by another name: the wide path or wide way. It is not the moral way to go – but it *is* easy! One thing that can cause a person to shift from the easy, wide path to the difficult, narrow path

is a sense of a loss of control . . . and a loss of confidence. Think about how decision-making attitude changes when a person is under attack.

Terrorist attacks and natural disasters seem to get people's attention. Suddenly, everybody needs God and is looking out for his fellow man. Then, the threat goes away, personal confidence rebuilds, and humanity is back to "who's God?" Or think about what a virus scare could make millions of people do to each other. And how myriads could forfeit their personal freedoms out of fear, as they lost control. Then again, confidence eventually rebuilds, and the wide way gets wider: let us now kill our preborn "problems." "Let's pass Proposal 3." Sure, these "problems" happen to be human beings but . . . whatever. "We've all got other stuff to do today, right?"

There is another thing, beside fear, that will motivate us to act out of consideration for others and follow "the narrow way." It is a life of Faith. Genuine faith in God teaches believers that they are never totally in control, that they are always in a state of dependence. The beauty of Faith is that we know who *is* in control – and He loves us. We can recognize our vulnerability and not panic, because we know God does not abandon us even in our darkest hour. Jesus himself went through the depth of darkness, and pulled the light of victory out of it for us. In Christ, we can make better decisions. We don't be hasty to make poor decisions by being too self-assured. But we will also know how to act confidently, because we strive to have the heart of Jesus when we do act.

Today we celebrate that Jesus is King of the universe; we celebrate His royal Kingship. For me, I clearly see Jesus as the Divine Healer, as Lord, as Savior, as friend, as Truth, as God and as my ultimate example and guide but for me, I struggle with seeing Him as King. I am certain that is because I view a king in a secular way. As I reflect on today's feast I am struck by the fact that I need to see Jesus as the King of my life and offer Him control of my every step, thought and action. On this feast, I need to focus on seeing His Kingdom around me daily. I am reflecting on my acknowledging Him, my King as ruler of my heart. This prayer that I found really helped shape my reflection today, I offer it to you in hopes that it helps guide your thoughts as well:

Lord, I invite You, today, to come reign in my heart. I give You complete control of my life. You are my Lord and my King. I love You and want to live in accord with Your perfect and holy will. Jesus, I trust in You. <https://catholic-daily-reflections.com/2018/11/14/jesus-is-king-2/>

With Advent here next Sunday, we as Church, look for ways to bring about a spirit of anticipation and an atmosphere of hope into our homes. We have much to compete with the modern society and emphasis on the monetary gifts at Christmas. Thankfully our faith is so rich in tradition and supported through all that the season of Advent has to offer us.

Advent is a time that we can turn our attention to the celebrations of the Church that help us keep our eyes on the true gift of Christmas...the Christ Child. Begin thinking now how you can share your family traditions of the Holy Days with your children. Try bringing a new family celebration into your homes. I was very surprised last year as I walked around the classrooms and talked with kids how many families do not have an advent wreath in their homes...here's today's challenge: if you do not have an advent wreath, please get one or make one and place it in the center of your meal time table. Use that tradition, symbol and prayers to keep the focus on the gifts of light, every lasting life, anticipation and celebration. If you do have and use an Advent wreath try something new this year such as an Advent prayer chain or Jesse Tree.

I also encourage you this Advent to focus a little deeper on the Mass and the riches granted to us within the Mass. As I talk with parents I hear all the challenges of doing it all and that often results in not attending Mass. Being a "practicing Catholic" means that if you want to be better at anything you do, you must continue to practice – for Catholics that can mean that we can practice our disciplines of prayer and worship – especially through the celebration of Mass.
