A message from the desk of Father Marreddy

Corpus Christi (Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ) Sunday, June 22, 2025-C Readings: Genesis 14:18-20; 1 Corinthians 11:23-26; Luke 9:11-17

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. In today's Gospel we come upon one of the many accounts of Jesus' multiplying food for the people. These miracles prefigure the Lord's offering of His Body and Blood. The Lord performs four actions which are repeated at every Mass: He takes; He blesses; He breaks; and He gives.

Do we hunger for God and for the abundant life He offers us through Jesus Christ? What is the significance of this miracle? The miraculous feeding of such a great multitude pointed to God's provision of *manna* (bread) in the wilderness for the people of Israel under Moses' leadership. When the people complained to Moses that they would die of hunger in the barren wilderness, God told Moses that He would "rain bread from heaven" for them to eat (Exodus 16:4,11-12). The miraculous provision of bread foreshadows the true heavenly bread which Jesus offers His followers who believe in Him. Jesus makes a claim only God can make: He is the "bread of life" (John 6:35) and the "true bread of heaven" that sustains us now and for all eternity (John 6:58).

Jesus' feeding of the five thousand is a sign of God's generous care and provision for His people. When God gives, He gives abundantly. He gives more than we need for ourselves so that we may have something to share with others, especially those in need. God takes the little we have and multiplies it for the good of others. Do we trust in God's provision for us and do we share freely with others, especially those who lack what they need?

Jesus' feeding of the five thousand points to the superabundance of the Lord's Supper or Eucharist. In the Old Covenant, bread and wine were offered as a sacrifice of thanksgiving to the Creator who made the earth fruitful to nourish and strengthen all his creatures. Melchizedek is an important Old Testament figure because he was both a priest and a king who offered a sacrifice of bread and wine to God on behalf of Abraham and his future offspring (Genesis 14:18; Hebrews 7:1-4). His offering prefigured the offering made by Jesus, our great high priest and king who gave a new and distinctive meaning to the blessing of the bread and the cup of wine when He instituted the "Lord's Supper" or "Eucharist" on the eve of His sacrifice on the Cross (Hebrews 7:26; 9:11; 10:12).


