A message from the desk of Father Marreddy

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 26, 2025-C

Readings: Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18; 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18; Luke 18:9-14

"The tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner.'" Lk 18: 9-14

The Pharisee and the tax collector ("publican") are images of two extreme religious attitudes. The Pharisee, who represented those who take pride in their religious practices, exalted himself at the expense of others. Absorbed with his own sense of self-satisfaction and self-congratulation, his boastful prayer was centered on his good religious practices rather than on God's goodness, grace, and pardon.

The tax collector, who represented those despised by religious-minded people, humbled himself before God and begged for mercy. His prayer was heard by God because he had true sorrow for his sins. He sought God with humility rather than with pride.

The parable contrasts two very different attitudes of prayer. **The Pharisee** approaches God seeking the reward he feels he deserves. His prayer is really a testimonial to himself for all the good things the Pharisee has done to merit God's grace. **The tax collector**, on the other hand, realizes his nothingness before God. He comes before God seeking His mercy because of the good things God has done for undeserving sinners like himself.

How can we know if our prayer is pleasing to God or not? The prophet Hosea, who spoke in God's name, said: "I desire steadfast love and not sacrifice" (Hosea 6:6). The prayers and sacrifices we make to God mean nothing to Him if they do not spring from a heart of love for God and for one's neighbor. How can we expect God to hear our prayers if we do not approach Him with humility and with a contrite heart that seeks mercy and forgiveness? We stand in constant need of God's grace and help. That is why Scripture tells us that "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble" (James 4:6; Proverbs 3:34).

Despising one's neighbor closes the door to God's heart. Expressing disdain and contempt for others is more than being mean-minded. It springs from the assumption that one is qualified to sit in the seat of judgment and to publicly shame those who do not conform to our standards and religious practices. *Do we humbly seek God's mercy, and do we show mercy to others, especially those we find difficult to love and to forgive?*


