



**New Horizons**  
**The Baptism of the Lord 2021**  
**by: Fr. Mark Watson, Pastor**

In today's Gospel John the Baptist is preparing the people for the coming of the Messiah. John presents Jesus as the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit. In the midst of his preaching Jesus himself comes forward and presents himself for baptism by John in the Jordan.

**John presents Jesus as the one that is mightier than he and who comes with a more powerful baptism, a baptism with the Holy Spirit.** John proclaims "a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins (Mark 1:4)." If Jesus is the Son of God, why would he need to be baptized? Jesus will baptize with a baptism more powerful than that of John and Jesus does not need the forgiveness of sins.

**The Baptism of the Lord is a manifestation by God the Father of who Jesus is and how much God loves him.** In the Eastern Churches the Baptism of the Lord is understood to be an Epiphany just as was the visitation of the Magi. As Jesus comes out of the water, he sees the heavens being opened up, the Holy Spirit comes down upon him and he hears the words, "You are my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased (Mark 1:11)." God the Father manifests to Jesus both that Jesus is the Son of God and that God loves him.

As a result of his baptism Jesus has an experience of God's great love for him and that God takes great delight in him. In his baptism the Holy Spirit comes down upon Jesus. Therefore, Jesus knows that the Holy Spirit accompanies him as he proclaims the kingdom through word and action. We are to know that God the Father and the Holy Spirit are with us as we live out our faith.

**The Baptism of the Lord marks a new beginning in the life of Jesus.** The ministry of Jesus is about to begin. Jesus now arrives proclaiming the good news of God's victorious reign. Jesus will do this through preaching, healing, confronting evil and raising the dead. Jesus brings a new hope to the world.

**The baptism of the Lord allows us to reflect on our own Baptism.** The baptism of the Lord was a defining moment in his life. While we may not remember the experience of our Baptism it is to be a defining moment in our lives.

**Baptism is an Initiation Sacrament.** Through Baptism we become members of the Church.

**Baptism is a Sacrament of Ministry.** Through our anointing with Sacred Chrism, which is part of the Baptism rite, we become members of the Body of the Christ. As members of the Body of Christ and the Priesthood of the Faithful we are to make Christ known in the world. Like Jesus in his baptism, we are empowered with the Holy Spirit. Through the Holy Spirit we are able to live out this ministry. Baptism is also a Sacrament of salvation. Baptism and faith are needed for salvation. Baptism is like a door through which we enter our journey for salvation. Through Baptism our sins are forgiven and we become adopted children of God.

**Given the importance of Baptism** in our spiritual lives I suggest you find the date of your Baptism. This way you will know this important date. As well you can celebrate it in some way each year.

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Merry Christmas! Share that cheerful greeting with some folks today. They may wonder if you have had any Elvis sightings lately, attended Star Trekkie conventions, or were Cleopatra in a previous lifetime. Despite the skeptics, today is solidly within the Christmas season. In fact, in some strands of the Christian tradition it represents the clearest manifestation of the mystery of the Incarnation. On Christmas Day, for example, the Gospel reading is the Prologue of John's Gospel, which reveals the glory of Christ shining through our humanity precisely in his baptism. At any rate, this is an ancient feast, celebrated first in Egypt sixteen centuries ago. More than most other ancient people, the Egyptians understood the life-giving properties of water. On this day, they drew water from the Nile, so central in the history of their people, and reserved it in honor. Many other places copied the custom, so that St. John Chrysostom wrote of people in Antioch gathering at midnight to collect flowing water into vessels they brought from home since "today there is a blessing on the water." At home for dinner tonight, decorate the table with beautiful bowls of water and white candles, toast one another with goblets of sparkling water, and light a Christmas candle in the window one last time.

### THE WATERS OF BAPTISM

When new sod is put in, it needs constant saturation with water. Landscapers say that this “knits” the sod to the soil. The same when a branch is grafted onto a tree: the poultice that joins them at the splice must be kept wet at all times. Water is the stuff that binds the very cells of our bodies together. No wonder religions throughout all times and cultures have used it so prominently. When Jesus stepped into the Jordan for baptism, he “knit” himself to what had come before him. By going to the Jordan, he made himself one with the people of Israel who had crossed it into their Promised Land. With John the Baptist, Christ wove himself into the prophetic tradition that heralded the coming reign of God. He had become fully human in the waters of Mary’s womb, and by partaking in the rite of the baptism of repentance, Jesus identified himself with our sinful, frail humanity. It is through the waters of baptism that Christ continues to graft new members onto his Body, the Church; through these waters we are cleansed from sin and filled with the promise of grace, given our destiny for eternal life. For us, as for Jesus, it is also the waters of baptism that inaugurate our mission to proclaim the Good News.

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### FEAST OF FAITH

#### The Sign of the Cross

At the beginning of our prayer, we make the sign of the cross together. This sign, simple and powerful, operates on many levels. We trace the sign of the cross over our bodies, reminding ourselves that the cross of Christ has become our source of resurrection, life, and grace. With this sign, we also profess our faith in the Trinity: the presider does not say “in the *names*,” but “in the *name* of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit”—three persons, one God. The sign of the cross is also a baptismal reminder, for every sign of the cross echoes the words spoken over us at our baptism, which marked our entry into the saving mystery of Christ. This many-layered sign is also our primary sign of blessing: the cross is traced over people, places, and things upon which we ask God to impart divine benediction.

In blessing ourselves with the sign of the cross at the beginning of Mass, we acknowledge the mystery that has gathered us together: that Christ, the crucified and risen One, is living, and that we are members of his Body. Our response, our Amen, is our yes to all this, our first profession of faith.
