
Sunday Reading Zoom Bible Study

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.**

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was an American Baptist Minister and activist who became the most visible spokesperson and leader in the Civil Rights Movement from 1955 until 1968. He organized a number of peaceful protests as head of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, including the March on Washington in 1963. He won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964, and, at the time, he was the youngest person to have done so.

Dr. King influenced people around the world. In a time of civil unrest, he advocated for peaceful approaches to some of society's biggest problems. He organized a number of marches and protests and was a key figure in the American Civil Rights movement. He was instrumental in the Memphis sanitation workers' strike, the Montgomery bus boycott, and the March on Washington. His advocacy of peaceful protest has permeated into contemporary social justice movements.

New Horizons
The Lamb of God

One aspect of Catholicism is that we believe that not only people and objects are holy but also that time is holy. We have just completed the Seasons of Advent in which we reflected on the Comings of the Lord: his coming into the world at Christmas and his final coming at the end of time. We have just celebrated the Season of Christmas in which we reflected on the meaning of the Incarnation and Manifestation of our Lord to the nations and at his Baptism. We look forward to the Season of Lent during which we will go through a conversion process as we prepare to celebrate Easter. We will then celebrate the Season of Easter during which we will unpack the meaning of the Resurrection and the new life we received in Baptism.

This Sunday we celebrate the beginning of Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time is the time during which we reflect on the ministry of Jesus and experience how God is working out the salvation of ourselves and those of the world.

In the first reading the boy Samuel is sleeping in the Temple at Shiloh. Before our first reading we find the verse: "During the time young Samuel was minister to the Lord under Eli, a revelation of the Lord was uncommon and vision infrequent (Samuel 3:1)." It had been a long time since God had spoken to his people.

God calls Samuel three different times while he is asleep and Samuel does not know it is the Lord. Each time he believes that Eli the priest has called him and so he goes to Eli and asks why he called. The first two times Eli believes Samuel is dreaming and so he tells him to go back to sleep. After the third time, Eli tells Samuel to say, "Speak Lord your servant is listening (1Samuel 3:10)." Then God speaks and Samuel listens.

God begins to do something new in Israel. God punishes Eli and his sons who were being unfaithful to God and God now uses Samuel to begin a new age of grace. The hour of the priest will now yield to the age of the prophet. This new age begins with Samuel and continues with Nathan, Amos, Hosea, Isaiah, Jeremiah and Ezekiel.

We see God's holy time at work as well in today's Gospel. John the Baptist sees Jesus walking by and calls out to two of his disciples, "Behold the Lamb of God (John 1:36)." Two of John's followers listen and begin to follow Jesus. Jesus turns around and invites the disciples to "Come and you will see (John 1:39)." They follow Jesus and stay with him from about 4 pm until the end of the day.

The moment of grace flows from one invitation to the next. Andrew later goes out and brings Simon to Jesus. Jesus names Simon, Cephas or Peter. Just as God's grace broke into the world when Jesus invited the disciples to stay with him and when Andrew invited Simon Peter to follow Jesus, so God's grace continues to break into our world.

The readings speak of God doing something new in Israel through Samuel and in the entire world through Jesus and his followers. Ordinary life is penetrated anew by the Word of God and the presence of God. May we be awake and ready to experience God's grace.

These readings also call us to share the truth of the faith with others. Eli shares the truth of God with Samuel and John shares the truth with Andrew who shares the truth with Simon. Andrew then brings Simon to Jesus. Had Andrew not shared his faith with Peter he might not have become the rock upon which the church was built.

May we listen to and follow the Lord's call as did Samuel and share the truth of our faith with others as did Andrew.

SPEAK, LORD, WE ARE LISTENING

In today’s first reading God keeps calling out in the night to a sleeping boy. Neither the boy, Samuel, nor his teacher, Eli, understands who is calling. But God’s persistence convinces them. Samuel is then ready—not ready yet to do anything, but ready to listen. “Speak, for your servant is listening” (1 Samuel 3:10).

In the Gospel Jesus is out teaching. Various people notice him and begin to gather around. They soon become disciples and, like the young Samuel, are ready—not ready yet to do anything, but ready to listen. “Speak,” they say, “we are listening.”

God’s voice is always with us, awake or asleep. It swirls around us like fog on a waterfront, enveloping us, gently urging us to wake up, to listen. Awareness of the voice comes first; then willingness to listen; then, in time, the decision to act, to live according to God’s word. Let’s ask today for the ability to keep our ears open so we don’t miss God’s voice. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

FEAST OF FAITH

The Greeting

At several points during the liturgy, the presider greets us with the words, “The Lord be with you.” These simple words are not like the greetings that we exchange all day long—our “good mornings,” our “hellos” and “how are yous.” This liturgical greeting has roots deep in the Old Testament. In the book of Ruth, the words “the Lord be with you” are spoken by Boaz to the harvesters who are laboring in his fields (2:4); in the book of Judges, an angel speaks similar words to Gideon (6:12), where they are words of promise: for soon Gideon will lead his oppressed people to victory and freedom. For us, the words become a greeting of peace, a prayer that the Lord will indeed be with us, and a reminder of his promise to be with us always, to the end of the world (Matthew 28:20). Our response—“And also with you,” soon to be “And with your spirit”—returns to the presider this prayer for the Lord’s presence. As we know from the scriptures, a prayer for the Lord’s presence is no small thing, for when God comes in our midst, God brings healing, grace, and challenge. God’s presence transforms
