Sunday Reading Zoom Bible Study



NEW HORIZONS
The Holy One of God

Each Gospel is written to meet the spiritual needs of a specific community. Scripture scholars believe that the Gospel of Mark was written in Rome before the year 70 AD. Half of the city of Rome had been burned in a great fire. The Emperor Nero blamed the fire on the Christian community and began a persecution against the Christians to punish them for the destruction. Saint Mark is thinking about the suffering of the Christian community in Rome as he writes his Gospel. In writing to a community that suffers Mark shows that Jesus is more powerful than the evil in the world. Mark also shows that Jesus is the Messiah that suffered as they suffer.

Today's Gospel helps to answer the question, "Who is Jesus?" The first verse of the Gospel has already given us an answer to that question. In the first verse we read, "The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ [the Son of God] (Mark 1:1)" In this Gospel Jesus is in the synagogue in Cafarnaum and he encounters a man who is possessed by an unclean spirit. The unclean spirit says, "I know who you are the Holy One of God (Mark 1:24)!" Holy refers to that which is separated from the ordinary and profane and implies a connection to God and the divine sphere. As the Holy One of God the demon recognizes that Jesus is not just a wise teacher. **Jesus reveals the person of God and the will of God.** By staying close to Jesus, we can become holy and share in God's divine life.

In the Gospel the people in the synagogue are astonished at his teaching, "for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes." The Gospel shows Jesus as a prophet. In our first reading Moses says that God will send a prophet from among his people. The Gospel shows Jesus to be the prophet that Moses promised. Jesus is the prophet who comes from God and thus teaches with authority.

The Jewish thought of the time held that the coming of the Kingdom of God would bring the defeat of evil, which is **arrayed in evil spirits**. Jesus teaches that in his life and ministry the kingdom of God is becoming a current reality. In casting out the evil spirit Jesus shows the people of his time and us that the kingdom of Satan is giving way to the kingdom of God. Thus, Jesus is the Stronger One who is more powerful than evil. In the Gospel the demon recognizes that Jesus is the Holy One of God and that Jesus' power is greater than his. Today the power of God continues to be more powerful than any evil that we experience in our lives.

We might ask why is the Kingdom of Satan so powerful in our lifetime if Jesus inaugurated the Kingdom of God over two thousand years ago? The answer is that the growth of the Kingdom of God happens slowly. Christ inaugurated the Kingdom of God and we have the duty of completing it. One answer as to why the Kingdom of Satan is slow in dying is because we do not fully live out the will of God in our own lives. For example, we do not love one another as Christ has called us to love.

Today's Gospel first of all reminds us that Christ is more powerful than the evil in the world. If we want the Kingdom of God to grow in the world and the Kingdom of Satan to decrease, we must come to know and to live out the will of God in our lives.

**4th Sunday B – Ordinary Time
31 January 2021

In the history of Israel there are some important figures that shaped this nation's future, survival and destiny. Among them, Moses is the most important key person that made a conglomerate of clans and tribes into a united and respected nation, admired, feared, fought and adulated. All this because God chose and favored Israel from the very beginning, granting them a special status and treatment. "*You alone I have known, among all the families of the earth; Therefore I will punish you for all your iniquities*" (Amos 3:2).

Today, in the first reading text, we hear Moses talking about God's promise of a much greater prophet from their own kin as they had earlier requested. An envoy, who would be likened to Moses, a messenger who would be endowed with more authority and more rendition of God's words; he would be sent in due time. Moses had a presentiment that his time of departing from this earth was nearing and did not want his compatriots to feel abandoned. He assured them that God will provide another clairvoyant and obedient leader.

Previously the children of Israel had voiced their fear of being annihilated by a direct contact with, perhaps I imagine, God's power and holiness. "*You [talking about Moses] speak to us, and we will listen; but do not let God speak to us, or we shall die*" (Exodus 20:19). In a well-disposed gesture, God respected their capricious wishes and accepted to "*raise up for them a prophet like you among their kin ... will put my words into his mouth; he shall tell them all that I command him.*"

However in this stricken deal there was a snag. Not really a hidden one but the usual stumbling block of forgetfulness, stubbornness and disobedience. "*Whoever will not listen to my words which he [my envoy, the second Moses] speaks in my name, I myself will make answer for it.*" No other prophet among all those listed in the Scripture did claim to be more than God's spokesperson. He will be his mouthpiece and represent him and extensively manifest his glory. That person, that second Moses, is Jesus Christ, the Word Incarnate and Messiah *to whom all things have been handed over* (Philippians 2:9). He will come back to judge the disobedient and the recalcitrant, who will have failed to listen to his words and did not act according to his commands.

Why should folks turn disobedient and prophets transmit false oracles derived from alien gods? A clear answer is difficult to pinpoint but the issue concerns our corrupt, perverted and sinful nature that eschew God's provided means to remain rooted, devoutly in his grace and blessings. We are never completely satisfied with what we have and are. We look and search for ways of changing our status to the detriment of God's prerogatives. And that is where and when mainly we open the windows for the devil and his evil spirits to enter our lives.

In today's Gospel we see Jesus helping with a man hosting an unclean spirit, a spirit hiding in the person sitting in the synagogue, pretending to be praying with the community. No one else had made it manifest its indwelling except Jesus empowered to enrage it, and engage it. After he had preached the word of God, the bad spirit could no longer hide itself. Jesus' power and authority unmasked it and drove it away. God allowed the manifestation of this evil spirit to make people aware of its presence among us and at any cost recognize God's rule if we want to remain unscathed. The devil is there to divert our faith and devotion, our love for God and holy practices. Only the presence of Christ in the Sacraments, in our prayer, in our adoration, in our worship and loyalty to him will remove the bad guy and his minions that only create havoc among the children of God.

FALSE PROPHETS, TRUE PROPHETS

In Deuteronomy today we hear that God's very words will fill the mouth of a true prophet, but a false prophet will, in a manner of speaking, put mere mortal words into God's mouth. In Mark's Gospel, we see Jesus teaching and healing as a true prophet, one filled with the authority of God's own voice, the Holy One of God.

The whole history of our church is filled with both true and false prophets. But in today's Gospel we learn that Jesus' fame spread because he taught with authority; he wasn't an authority because he was popular or famous. We also learn from him, in his desert temptation confrontations with Satan, that anyone can quote scripture, even against God's purposes. And today we hear that his authority was not like that of the scribes, who held the official positions of religious authority in his day. Our work is to do our best to discern the true prophets in our midst, and to be true prophets as well. The psalmist tells us how to do this: by not hardening our hearts when God speaks. If we truly listen to God, it will be God's very words filling our mouths.

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FEAST OF FAITH

I Confess

One form of the penitential rite at the beginning of Mass is the traditional *Confiteor*, or "I confess," a prayer that was formerly prayed by the priest alone at the foot of the altar, but which is now prayed by the entire assembly. The *Confiteor* is at once personal—"I confess"—and communal, prayed aloud, together. We recognize that sin does not just separate us from God; sin comes between us and others, isolating us. We acknowledge that sin has many dimensions, individual and communal: sins of thought, sins of speech, sins of action, sins of omission. Sin is not something that happens to us; sin is something we do. In the *Confiteor*, we take responsibility for our own actions. The repeated insistence on our "fault," with the ritual gesture of striking the breast, an ancient sign of penitence, is not meant to lower our self-esteem. Rather, it acknowledges our human instinct to transfer the blame whenever we can ("The devil made me do it!"). This prayer stops us short. We take responsibility for ourselves, our actions, our failure to act. Then we cry out to God in those ancient words, *Kyrie, eleison*—Lord, have mercy. For the sinner who repents, there is mercy. This truth is at the heart of our faith, and it is where the Mass, our feast of faith, begins.
