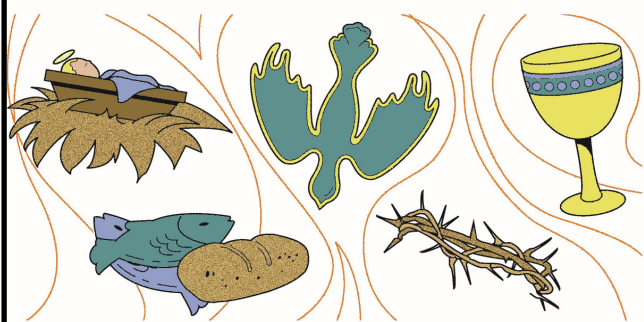

DIOCESAN STEWARDSHIP APPEAL 2021

The Diocesan Stewardship Appeal takes place this weekend, February 27/28. Bishop Malone has just finished his first year as our bishop. The Diocesan Stewardship Appeal was very successful as \$1,256,000.00 were raised. I am hoping that our parish can help the diocese to be equally successful this year. As we begin the Diocesan Stewardship Appeal, I ask that all parishioners prayerfully consider donating to this important campaign.

Last November we celebrated Stewardship Sunday for our parish. The Diocesan Stewardship Appeal reminds us as members of the Diocese of Shreveport we have a responsibility to build up and strengthen our diocese. Truly God has placed the Diocese of Shreveport in our hands. One of the best ways that we can do this is through participating in the Diocesan Stewardship Appeal. The goal for our parish both this year and last is \$18,500. Last year our parish donated \$10,665 to the Appeal. Of our parishioners 47 donated last year. I was very pleased with our generosity last year and I am certain that we will do even better this year.

Two thoughts come to mind as I write this article. First, while we are dedicated to Sacred Heart, we are also part of something larger. We are not only members of this church community; we are also part of the Diocese of Shreveport. Therefore, I ask that you show your support of our diocese through this appeal. Second, just as we have to budget money in order to meet the needs of our families so our new bishop has to budget money in order to meet the needs of the ministries of our diocese. It is therefore important that we give to the Diocesan Stewardship Appeal in order that needed ministries will be able to thrive in our diocese.

In reflecting on the diocesan response to last year's Appeal, Bishop indicated how he was impressed with the generosity of the diocese. This was especially true given the challenges we experienced from the Covid19 pandemic. He was both thankful for the generosity of parishioners last year and looks forward to the same generosity this year. The success of the Diocesan Service Appeal will help the diocese "recover from 2020, and work toward a brighter, more productive 2021."

Among the many ministries assisted by the Appeal are diocesan seminarians. Our gifts this year are essential in covering the education costs of the seven seminarians who are currently journeying to ordination for our diocese. Your gifts to the Diocesan Steward Appeal also cover the costs of the Vocation Office of the Diocese which helps Catholics in our area discern their vocation. On June 2, 2021 we look forward to celebrating the diaconate ordination of Nicolas Duncan and on June 5, 2021 the priesthood ordination of Raney Johnson.

Appeal dollars also support our retired and infirm priests. The appeal is an important source of funds for the retired priests of the diocese. These funds provide them stability and comfort. In 2021, a significant portion of Appeal funding is dedicated to offering our retired priests a well-deserved quality of life in their later years.

The Catholic Connection is fully funded by the Appeal. This unique, award-winning magazine is sent out to every known Catholic household in the diocese free of charge on a monthly basis.

The Appeal helps to fund the diocesan Office of Hispanic Ministry. These funds help to fund retreats for youth, and young adults in the Hispanic Community. These funds have also helped to build train leaders in the Hispanic community of our diocese.

The Saint Vincent de Paul Society and Catholic Charities are assisted with funds from the Appeal. Catholic Charities offers assistance with employment searches, rent, utility bills, food and clothing as well as the Money School which assists low income individuals with financial planning. Catholic Charities also continues to provide critical immigration services to new arrivals in our region which helps them to become active Catholics in our diocese. SVDP assists the vulnerable through home visitation in order that they can have the basic necessities of life. Appeal dollars assist the Saint Vincent de Paul Society within our parish.

Our diocese takes a leadership role in organizing and supporting Pro-life programs and family life outreach programs. These programs are assisted through dollars from the Appeal. I especially appreciate the Pro-Life materials that the diocese sends to each parish before Respect Life Sunday.

Appeal donations support Youth and Young Adult Ministry. This includes training youth and young adult leaders so that they can share the faith with youth in parishes. This also includes helping to fund bi-annual trips to Indianapolis, Indiana for the NCYC Conference.

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Today's first reading from the Book of Genesis illustrates why Abraham is known as the father of Faith. This narrative is horrifying, yet from the beginning to the end there seems to be a complete acceptance with Abraham's response to God, "Here I am." Keep in mind that Isaac represents the future of what has come to be, since God had promised the elderly Abraham that he would carve out a great nation from among Abraham's descendants. The death of Isaac would nullify God's covenant with Abraham. By sacrificing his only son, Abraham would not only lose his son but also the future of millions to come, to whom God had pledged his faithfulness. Because Abraham acted as he did, not withholding Isaac from God, He blessed Abraham abundantly.

To some this is a disturbing reading because Abraham believed that God was requiring him to sacrifice his son. Back in the days of Abraham human sacrifice was a common activity among many pagan religions. In addition to testing Abraham's faith, God wanted to make it clear to Abraham, that HE does not require human sacrifice. In fact, something remarkably opposite happens. Instead of Abraham being required to procure a sacrifice, God provided Abraham with a ram. A ram is, of course, a sheep and this foreshadowed the Passover lamb of Exodus. The Passover lamb foreshadowed Jesus' sacrifice for us by becoming the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.

2nd If God is for us, who can be against us? Answer only us. By putting God second to the desires of the world.

We all have transfiguration moments. One of mine was a camping accident where a tree fell on our camper. This large tree collapsed our trailer where our youngest son was sleeping. In the darkness of the night, I was unable to see. In this moment of terror, I was unable to lift this tree from where my son was sleeping. All the while our oldest son was crying a tree had killed his brother. In this life changing moment thinking my son was dead, I cried out to God, "Father I love my son so, please do not take him from me, but thy will be done." By the light from above (lighting), I was able to see a lump under the canvas along the side of the tree. In the darkness I carry our son Michael, out from under the curve of the tree. I walked from the darkness into the light, a light that was not there before. Michael was alive. This was a transfiguration for me that changed my life forever.

Whether it is connecting with God through nature, a moving retreat, or perhaps the transfiguring words of someone wise, perhaps it was a story from scripture, a parable from our Lord, or perhaps it was a special liturgy, we all have moments in our lives when we feel transfigured. Perhaps it was the first kiss when you were falling in love. Perhaps it was the first time you looked into the eyes of your newborn child. We all have transfiguration moments in life when God is present in that moment and you are never the same again. Discipleship calls all of us to a lifetime of transfiguration. To do so, we need to take the time and meditate on questions like: who am I, who is Jesus, and where am I going? What must I change in my life to conform to a life like Jesus? What can I do to make a positive difference in the world? What action is Jesus calling me to. I invite you to take a little time this week and reflect on these and other questions. Perhaps write down your answers and look at them again in a few months to see if your answers have changed. I believe a good starting point this Lent would be to recognize and remember the transfiguration moments in your life and to prayerfully discern why you had a transfiguration moment in the first place. Where was God leading you then? Where is God leading you now? This Sunday the Lord takes us up a mountainside so we can see the world around us from a higher perspective, with God's eyes. If we accompany Jesus up that mountain, over time we may notice a radical transfiguration at work in our own lives. As we make our way with Jesus from our Mount Tabors to our Good Fridays in life, we are invited to never lose sight of where Jesus is eventually leading us. Our current destination is our Easter hope, resurrection, and life. To get there, we need to know who we are, where we are going, and recommit ourselves each day to following Jesus who is the way, the truth, and the life.

Lent is a call not just to "give up something" but more important to "give something for the poor." Wherever you live in the parish, there are poor families within walking distance of your home. When in need, they ring the rectory bell. They are, in effect, ringing your doorbell.

By your gift to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul you indeed put your gift into action as you bring healing to the poor, hungry and weeping.

Welcome back! We had 1 volunteer contract the virus. Thankfully, she recovered but has to be very careful. We thank God for her recovery. We closed the pantry 5 months after that due to the COVID. We reopened in September, 2020. On the clothing side, SVdP permits only 2 persons at a time come in for clothes. No "friends in need" are allowed to come in on the food side. Food is brought to them down the ramp. It's been slower than usual. With so few allowed to come in, the weather plays a part of the slow down. Waiting outside in the cold is no fun. We try to rush as much as possible. To catch up a little, in November we gave out 51 Thanksgiving baskets with a hen. We set up our table outside to give each family a basket. It was warm and sunny so we actually enjoyed it. We were so blessed by your generosity in your food donations for Thanksgiving with so few people coming to church in this serious COVID season. Our angel tree went well, too. All the angels were taken off the tree the first weekend! We lowered the age of the children this time from infant through 12 years to infant through 10 years. We had only 27 family families consisting of 70 children. Again, your generosity was very appreciated.

SVDP EASTER LENTEN PROJECT:

Please take a Lenten Project Paper Bag home with you. The items on the bag are items that cannot be bought with Food Stamps. We carefully distribute them to those in need. Helping others during Lent is a great Lenten promise! Thank you in advance for always supporting this project. We are now collecting Easter bunnies for our Easter baskets. If you have bunnies needing a new home, please consider donating them to SVdP. We use just about any stuffed animal because we never have enough bunnies.
