

Homily-The Man Born Blind by: Fr. Mark Watson, Pastor

FR. MIKE JOLY

In last weekend's bulletin I wrote about Fr. Mike Joly who will offer the Easter Mission at St. Mary of the Pines. The life of Fr. Mike speaks to the meaning of this weekend's Gospel. At six years old Mike lost his eyesight due to a brain tumor. While in college he remembered a specific time when he knew there was more to life than what he was living. This discovery led him to enter the seminary. While in seminary Mike was amazing: he had many friends; he served on the altar as a deacon; he even played the piano at Mass.

Since his ordination he has been active in various aspects of pastoral ministry. **Fr. Joly's faith is shown in the following quote:** "Having the light turned out in your life means we can only look inside; I couldn't ignore God inside of me." Fr. Joly's life shows that God does not only heal physically but also spiritually.

THE MAN BORN BLIND

While in Jerusalem, Jesus encounters a man who was born blind. Jesus makes a paste of mud and places it on the man's eyes. Jesus tells the man to wash in the Pool of Siloam. Without questioning Jesus, the man responds.

After washing in the Pool, the man returns seeing and is greeted by neighbors who cannot believe that he was the one born blind. The neighbors ask him how he was cured and the man replies that Jesus asked him to wash in the pool. The action of Jesus leads to division among the people. Some people do not believe that this was the man who they once knew. It seems that the man born blind does not know the identity of Jesus.

Hauled next before the Pharisees, who are concerned about the Sabbath healing, he again repeats what Jesus did. The Pharisees and the man born blind then argue as to whether Jesus is of God. The man states he believes that Jesus is "a prophet" which shows a growth in faith.

Summoned again by the leaders, the man is immediately confronted with the charge that Jesus is a sinner. The man witnesses that Jesus is from God and in anger the Jewish leaders expel him from the synagogue. The leaders fail to believe that Jesus has healed this man by the power of God. They will not accept that Jesus is from God.

Doubted by friends and neighbors (vv. 8-12), abandoned by his parents (vv. 18-23), questioned, insulted and cast out by "the Jews" he is "found" by Jesus, who asks, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" The man replies, "Lord, I believe." He grows from seeing Jesus as a man, to a prophet, to a suggestion that he must be from God and he finally prostrates himself before Jesus.

In the Gospel the blind man moves toward sight while the Jewish leaders toward blindness. Through opposition and persecution, the blind man moves to a confession of Jesus as the Son of Man and Lord. At the same time, the leaders who seemed perfectly well become increasingly blind.

CONCLUSION

This Gospel challenges us to grow in faith and to walk in light. We are reminded that Jesus is the Light of the World. Our enlightenment and consequent growth in faith began in baptism and from our Baptism we are called to continually grow in faith. During Lent we take stock of our lives and change so that we may grow in faith and walk in the light of Christ.




EASTER EGG HUNT

GOD'S MERCY

Today's reading from the second book of Chronicles contains a sort of "mini-history" of Israel. It highlights God's mercies in choosing Cyrus the Persian to be an instrument of deliverance when the people were in captivity in Babylon. Despite their sinfulness and the deserved punishment they were undergoing, God's mercy was lavished on the people in the form of a miraculous act of liberation.

The Letter to the Ephesians, in much more theological terms, gives a similar account of a God "who brought us to life with Christ—by grace you have been saved." The author stresses that it was when we were "dead in our transgressions" that God saved us, an act of pure grace. He emphasizes that it is not our own efforts that freed us from sin ("this is not from you"); rather, "it is the gift of God." This, of course, is the heart of the entire Pauline corpus, that salvation comes to us by faith in God's mercy, revealed in the death of Jesus.
