**NEW HORIZONS
THE ASCENCION

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension. The Ascension marks the end of the time in which the Lord lived on earth and the time at which the Lord was taken into heaven. The Ascension celebrates as well the point at which the disciples were sent forth to bring the Good News of Jesus to the ends of the earth.

As a result of the Ascension, we are not only witnesses but we are also pilgrims. We are pilgrims in that we are each on a journey to eternal life. The Ascension reminds us that where Jesus has gone, we hope to follow. Our entire life is a journey. This journey began at Baptism and continues until we pass from this life into eternal life. In this life we experience abundant life and we look ahead to experiencing the abundance of eternal life in heaven. Each of us is imperfect and broken. We need others to support and strengthen us as we journey to eternal life. On this journey we are never alone. We journey through this life as members of a Christian community in which we each receive support and strength during our journey to eternal life.

The Easter Season reminds us that we not only journey with members of our Church community but also with the Risen Lord and the Holy Spirit. Both are needed on this pilgrim journey. Christ feeds us on this journey with the Eucharist.

Our very lives are to be characterized by the idea that we are journeying to eternal life. While we are tempted to only focus on the beauty of the world around us, the Ascension reminds us that we are journeying to a homeland of eternal life and peace. Our lives should focus on that destiny.


The first reading of today's Mass is taken from the Acts of the Apostles. The Acts of the Apostles shows that Christ ascended on high in order that the disciples might receive his Spirit. The disciples have received his Holy Spirit so that they can be witnesses of Jesus Christ in the world.

Just as the prophet Elijah sent his spirit into the life of his disciple Elisha so Jesus ascends on high so that he can send his Holy Spirit into the lives of his followers and they will be empowered to be his prophetic followers and to continue his work. Jesus Christ then sent his Holy Spirit into the lives of his disciples at Pentecost. The Ascension thus becomes the event which makes the sending of the Spirit possible.

The Ascension marks the point at which the apostles must take up the mission begun by Jesus. The Ascension has the same meaning for us. We like the first apostles have been filled with the Spirit of God so that we can be witnesses of Jesus Christ.

The angel who spoke to the Apostles in the first reading asks them to go back to Jerusalem and to pray for the "the power of the Father" meaning the Holy Spirit. The original novena of the Church was this prayer of the Apostles from the Ascension to the experience of Pentecost. Let this week from now until Pentecost be a time of prayer and openness to God for each of us.

The Ascension for St. Luke was a time in which Jesus passed his ministry to his followers. This Ascension let us commit ourselves to more fully follow Jesus and make his ministry a greater part of our lives. Between now and Pentecost let us pray that Christ will empower us with his Spirit so that we will be true witnesses of Jesus Christ.

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE ASCENSION

The theological unity, or perhaps even the temporal experience of the early community, made it seem that Jesus' resurrection and his ascension were inseparable aspects of a single mystery. Only in the later writings of Luke and John has further theological reflection helped the Christian community to distinguish different dimensions of the mystery. Liturgical tradition has followed the forty-day chronology formulated by Luke. We would miss the point, however, if we were to demand a precise historical chronology of events such as the Resurrection-Ascension that are primarily spiritual in nature and that clearly surpass the bounds of time and space as we know them.

What is important for us to grasp is the significance of the Ascension. For Luke, it is the decisive turning point that marks the end of Jesus' earthly ministry and the beginning of the disciples' Spirit-led ministry and thus the ministry of the whole church down to our own day.

Today as we celebrate the feast of the Ascension we are reminded that Christ's saving work on earth continues through his disciples. . . And now through us.

When we give to the poor, God indeed pours his love, peace and joy into our hearts, into our lives and into the Hearts of those who are poor.

In April your St. Vincent de Paul fed 31 households, which included 21 children, 33 adults, 5 seniors, and 3 homeless. Food costs were \$271.23 for 2,370 pounds of food. Utility help for 1 family was \$50. A man with severe health problems was being evicted from the motel if he didn't pay immediately. We paid \$140. We rarely give that much but this was a very sad situation. The motel did let him delay another \$40 until May 1st on his weekly rate of \$180. He was so grateful to SVdP. It relieved him of so much stress. Praying that he goes to a hospital soon!

Many, many thanks to all the people who gave so generously to the Give for Good campaign. Sacred Heart always comes through for the less fortunate.
