

New Horizons
The Storm at Sea - June 20, 2021

MY STORY

We have all been through times in which life seemed like a wave crashing down upon us. And in the midst of those challenges, it seemed as if God were far away

THE STORY OF MARK'S COMMUNITY

The Gospel that we heard proclaimed in today's Mass spoke to what the disciples of Mark's community were experiencing. Mark's community lived in Rome and experienced the persecution of the Roman Emperor Nero. Many of the Christians in Rome lost their lives in that persecution.

THE STORY OF JOB AND THE PSALM

In the Old Testament the sea was thought to be a place of chaos, evil and death. At the beginning of creation, it was believed that God brought order to the waters of the earth. To be buffeted by a storm at sea was to be caught in extreme terror.

The Book of Job deals with the relation of suffering to human behavior. Is suffering always a punishment? Why do the innocent suffer?

From the midst of his suffering Job challenges God about the suffering that he is experiencing. In the reading from Job, God shows that only he created the sea and only he brought limits to the sea. The creation of the sea shows both the power and love of God. The Book of Job shows that the wise person finds meaning in suffering and trusts that the Lord governs the universe with purpose.

Psalm 107 is the Responsorial Psalm of today's Mass. In the psalm sailors experience a storm at sea. Only God is able to calm the storm at sea. Psalm 107:6, 29. "He hushed the storm to a gentle breeze, and the billows of the sea were stilled." The sailors give thanks to God for His saving work on their behalf.

THE STORY OF JESUS

Today's Gospel takes place late at night. There is a terrible storm at sea and waves are breaking over the boat. While the boat is being tossed by the sea Jesus is lying in the stern of the boat asleep on a cushion. The disciples are afraid for their lives and believe that Jesus is not paying attention to their plight.

They lack faith in the powerful Word of Jesus which can conquer the evil powers of the wind and the waves. They wake Jesus up and asks whether he cares that they are perishing. Jesus merely said, "Quiet! Be still (Mark 4:39)!" The wind ceased and there was a great calm. The forces of nature are submissive to him. In calming the sea Jesus does what only God can do. Jesus is the presence and agent of God.

The Gospel points to the lack of faith of the disciples. They still do not understand the identity of Jesus. The reading also shows that faith is a process that takes time, often much time, to develop. The disciples ask, "Who then is this, whom even wind and sea obey (Mark 4:41)?" The reading not only shows the power of Jesus but also challenges us to trust that Christ does protect us from all of the challenges that come against us in life.

FATHERS LEAD TO CHRIST

Today we celebrate Father's Day. We give thanks for our fathers. This reading is a challenge to the fathers of this community, to have faith and trust in Christ, especially in the most challenging of times.

THE WIND AND THE SEA

Living along the shores of Lake Superior—the “big lake,” as the locals call it—you can often hear the advice, “Respect the lake; don’t take it for granted.” People who know Lake Superior respect its power and watch out for its many moods. Sunken ships and boats crushed into kindling are testimonies to what the lake can do.

The readings of this Sunday evoke our memories of the lake, of the mighty Mississippi River, or of the ocean itself. Who but God can control these mighty waters and set limits to their advance? The lake described in today’s Gospel was a body of water subject to sudden storms and churned into dangerous waves by terrible winds.

But these mighty agents are subject to God. The sailor and the fisher all respect the water. Even more, they respect the awesome power of the Maker of wind and sea.

FEAST OF FAITH

The Collection: A Privilege

As the altar is prepared for the celebration of the Eucharist, the collection is taken up. In the early church, this part of the Mass must have been something to behold, as the people suddenly began to move, bringing forward to the deacons and priests freshly-baked bread and fine wine. Then, after the Eucharistic Prayer, that same community came forward again in the Communion procession, and they received back the very gifts they had given, now transformed into something infinitely more precious than bread and wine: the very Body and Blood of Christ.

Beginning around the eleventh century, it became the custom for people to present money instead of bread and wine, and the procession of the faithful gradually disappeared (it survives in the liturgy of Holy Thursday). But the meaning is the same. We continue to bring the fruit of our labors and to offer them freely to God. And God continues to transform them into Christ. It is through our generous sharing of time, talent, and treasure that our parishes can preach the gospel, reach out to the sick and the imprisoned, and celebrate the sacraments.
