New Horizons
The Mission of the Twelve – 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

ST. FRANCIS

One of my favorite saints is St. Francis of Assisi. After living teenage years in comfort and wealth his town entered a war with a nearby town. Francis joined the fight and he was taken prisoner. After being kept in a dungeon for one year, it took him a full year to regain his health. This experience changed his life. He left his home and lived in a church on the outskirts of Assisi. There he spent hours alone in prayer and helped the poorest that he encountered.

While in Mass he heard the Gospel reading that we just heard. Upon hearing this reading Francis believed that God was calling him and so he decided to radically change his life. Francis decided to journey forth in poverty and preach the Gospel in towns and villages. He, like the disciples, would take very little with him, go and live-in utter poverty and care for the poor. The new community that Francis formed imitated his life of poverty.

AMOS AND AMAZIAH

The first reading is about a shepherd and one who cared for sycamore trees named Amos. Amos was from the small town of Takeo about 12 miles south of Jerusalem in the Southern Kingdom of Judah. He prophesied in about the year 762 BC. God called Amos to challenge the people of the Northern Kingdom because of their faithlessness in living out their covenant with God. Thus, Amos journeys as a foreigner. God called Amos to journey to the Temple of Beth-El in the Northern Kingdom of Israel.

The priest of the temple of Beth-El was named Amaziah. He accepted the message of Amos when he denounced the foreign cities and kingdoms around Israel such as Damascus, Tyre and Judah. But Amaziah became enraged when Amos began to proclaim the destruction of the shrines and temples of Israel and the end of the house of the king Jeroboam as a result of the faithfulness of the people of the Northern Kingdom. Amaziah alleges that Amos is prophesying for money and so attempts to banish Amos from the temple in Bethel and force him to return to his home in Judah. Amaziah is saying that Amos is not speaking the Word of God but instead his own word. Amos responds that he is not a prophet but a herdsman and a dresser of sycamore trees. Thus, he wasn't looking for the task of prophesying but it was God that called him. Amos merely followed God's call. Amos is courageous as he, a shepherd and farmer, challenges two of the strongest institutions of the time – the monarchy and the priesthood. Like Amos, we may not be trained theologically, but we are still called to proclaim God's Word to those whom we encounter in our lives.

PROCLAIMING THE KINGDOM OF GOD

Prior to today's Gospel, Jesus was proclaiming the Kingdom of God. While in Nazareth, the preaching of Jesus is rejected. Instead of giving up, Jesus sends out his disciples to proclaim the Kingdom of God. The disciples are sent out with the same message and ministry of Jesus. They preach repentance and the coming of the Kingdom. They receive power from Jesus to cast out demons and to heal the sick.

Jesus commands that the disciples take very little on their journey. They are to only take a staff and sandals. The disciples are to trust that God will care for them as they proclaim the message and do the work of Jesus. We likewise are to have faith that God will care for us as we make Christ known through our lives.

CONCLUSION

Today the Gospel challenges us to see ourselves as apostles who are part of a missionary community. Jesus sends the disciples out on mission. The root of the word that Mark uses in the Gospel for "to send forth" is the same root from which we get the word apostle. Just as Jesus chose, called and sent the disciples forth so in our Baptism we were chosen, called and sent forth to make Christ known in the world. As Pope Francis has said we are "missionary disciples." Just as Jesus empowered the disciples to continue his preaching and ministry to the people near the Sea of Galilee so through our Baptisms, we are empowered by the Holy Spirit to share the truth of salvation through Christ with those we encounter. We are especially empowered to share this truth with those marginalized and in spiritual and material need. Are we prepared to answer this call?

GOD CHOSE US

Who chose first, God or you? That is the question explored in today's three readings. The second reading, from Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, reads almost like a hymn. It praises God for choosing us, for calling us to serve, and for blessing us in our service. Paul makes it clear how honored we are and how special is the call to live as children of God. This is through no doing of our own.

The first reading and the Gospel use prose rather than poetry to describe the same truth: God did the choosing, not us. When the prophet Amos was berated for being a prophet, he retorted that the whole thing wasn't his idea in the first place. Neither did the twelve apostles in today's Gospel ask for their calling. 
FEAST OF FAITH Invitation to the Eucharistic Prayer

After the presider washes his hands, he turns to the people and says, "Pray that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God the almighty Father." We have brought forward bread and wine, and now we are asked to see in these simple gifts upon the altar a sacrifice offered to God. Our response is rich in theological meaning. "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands." The words point to the unique role of the priest, whose hands, at his ordination, were anointed for just this purpose: that he might "sanctify the Christian people and offer sacrifice to God" (*Rite of Ordination*). We ask God to accept our sacrifice not because it is worthy of God, but simply "for the praise and glory of his name." God does not need our offering, but allows us to give it so that we might grow in holiness. And God, never to be outdone in generosity, gives all that we have given back to us, "for our good and the good of all his Church." This Mass benefits not just those who have gathered, but, in the mysterious economy of grace, the whole Church. In the words of Saint Paul, when one part rejoices, the whole body "share[s] its joy" (1 Corinthians 12:26).
