

**New Horizons**  
**Who is the Greatest?**  
**by: Fr. Mark Watson, Pastor**  
**September 19, 2021**

**First announcement of the passion**

Last Sunday's Gospel took place as Jesus was about to begin his journey to the cross. He wanted to know that the crowd and especially that the disciples knew who he was. Jesus asked them, "Who do people say that I am?" They said in reply, 'John the Baptist, others Elijah or one of the prophets.' And he asked them, 'But who do you say that I am? (Mark 8:27-29)' It was Peter who answered, "You are the Messiah. (Mark 8:29)"

Then Jesus taught his disciples that the Son of Man was to suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the scribes, be killed and rise after three days. Jesus called his disciples and all the people and said to them: "Whoever wishes to come after me, must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it. (Mark 8:34-35)" Jesus shows that to be one of his disciples is to imitate his self-sacrificial love.

**Second announcement of the passion**

In today's gospel Jesus and his disciples are in the area of the Sea of Galilee and are journeying toward Judea. Jesus again speaks of his passion and death. The apostles do not understand the meaning of his death and resurrection and so do not question him about his words.

When they arrive at the home where they are staying in Capernaum, Jesus asks them, "What were you arguing about on the way? (Mark 9:33)" In their embarrassment they remain silent. Jesus says to the Twelve, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all. (Mark 9:35)" Jesus is saying that they are to let go of their jealousy and ambition. They are to imitate the self-sacrifice that Jesus showed in dying on the cross. Thus, among those who follow Jesus, the most important are those who serve. The cross is central to discipleship. Following Jesus is serving others as did Jesus.

Jesus then took a child, placed him in their midst, embraced him, and said to them, "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me. (Mark 9:37)" Children were thought to have little value in the time of Jesus. Jesus is saying that when one receives the lowliest member of the Christian community, sent by Jesus, they receive Jesus and in receiving Jesus they receive God the Father who sent Jesus. Followers of Jesus are important because they represent Jesus and Jesus represents the Father. The least follower of Jesus has dignity as they are sent by Jesus.

In society those who are seemingly most important are they who have money and fame. But it's different with Jesus. To Jesus and thus in the Church, the most important are those who serve others. Those who are most important put others before themselves. To follow Jesus, we must assist and respect all in Jesus' name. We must, see Christ in those who are powerless. The apostles do not understand the significance of the cross. Jesus identifies with those who have least power in their society. We have to see with the eyes of Jesus.

**To cultivate peace**

In our second reading St. James notices that the members of his community are being driven by jealousy and ambition. He calls the community members to be driven rather by holiness from above. Those that live out God's will, live in peace and mercy towards others. St. James says that the conflicts between community members come from the inner passions of the members. The members of his community should focus on conversion which will help them live out God's will. May we change the sinful inclinations in our lives so that we may live in peace with our sisters and brothers.

May we focus our discipleship on the cross of Christ. May we be a people of service as was our Lord and Savior.
