New Horizons: Fifth Sunday of Lent

Newness of Life

I have always loved the idea that the meaning of Lent is Spring time. To me it says that during Lent God brings spiritual renewal to our lives. During Lent we open our lives to God in faith. Through faith and conversion we enter a new relationship with God and we are renewed.

ISAIAH

Our first Reading comes from Deutero-Isaiah. It was written when the people of Judah were in exile in Babylon. God is about to set them free for their journey to the Promised Land. The first reading uses the imagery of the Exodus when God freed his people from slavery in Egypt and guided them through the desert to the Promised Land.

In the reading God says through the prophet that he is doing something new. God will create a way through the desert for the people to journey to Jerusalem. For us Lent is a time of spiritual renewal. As a result of our conversion, prayer, sacrifices, generosity and fasting, God can draw near to us, forgive us and allow us to enter a new relationship of life and love which leads to eternal life. So Lent leads to spiritual renewal and new life as a result of our faith and conversion. Lent is a Season of experiencing this new life in Christ.

GOSPEL

Jesus is teaching a crowd. The scribes and Pharisees lead a woman in front of Jesus and in the middle of the crowd. The men use the women as an object in order to trap Jesus in speech. This woman, who is facing death is certainly afraid. Her fear is of no account to the scribes and Pharisees. They know that such a woman should be stoned. But they do not want to learn about the Law but only to put Jesus in a situation in which his words are in conflict with the Law.

Jesus looks down and writes on the ground. As they continue to ask him, he stands up and says, “Let him who is without sin cast the first stone” (John 8:7). The scribes and Pharisees leave. The crowd probably leaves as well.

Jesus speaks directly to the woman. “Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?” (John 8:10). These are the first words addressed to the woman in the account. She is no longer an object but someone who can enter a relationship with Jesus. She shows her respect for Jesus by calling him “Lord.” She says that no one has condemned her.

Jesus tells the woman not to sin any more. The command to sin no more offers her the possibility of newness of life in a right relationship with God. Jesus forgives this sinner on his own authority. Jesus goes beyond the Law and offers this woman forgiveness and ultimately a new way of life. Jesus saves her life and allows her to begin again.

As with this woman Lent gives us the opportunity to begin again in our relationship with God. May we take advantage of this opportunity so that we may draw close to God and so deepen our relationship with God. This relationship of faith and conversion with God will ultimately lead to eternal life.

Jesus knew that the scribes and Pharisees were trying to trap him. They put him in what seemed to be a no-win situation. Let the woman who was caught in adultery go, and he would have been accused of ignoring the law. Let her be stoned, and he would fail to show mercy toward her, contradicting his life's message. Jesus' response teaches three crucial lessons: none of us is free of sin; we are not the ultimate judges of others; Jesus is the mercy of God, in whom we can always trust. In Christ, God does something new. When we give our hearts to Christ, we have the hope of new life, a life in which mercy reigns.



AN AGE-OLD STORY OF JUDGEMENT

In our Gospel today we hear an ancient story, but one that feels like it could be taken out of the headlines today. We can be very quick to pass judgment on others, those with different political or cultural backgrounds, or perhaps with a different sexual orientation. Jesus was teaching in the temple, and the scribes and Pharisees did not like the message that he was proclaiming or the popularity he was gaining. When a nearby woman was caught in adultery, they thought it was the perfect chance to trip Jesus up, wondering how he would respond when the Mosaic Law provided clear consequences for such behavior. Many would be able to quote instantly chapter and verse of the law pertaining to the infraction. Instead of answering their question, Jesus turned it back on the accusers: "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her."
