

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER
“Divine Mercy Sunday”

“On the evening of that first day of the week...”

Today the Gospel of John is telling us, not only is it the first day of the week, Sunday, but it is also the beginning of a whole new world.

For John is introducing us to Jesus as he, Jesus, introduced himself to his own disciples coming back to them from the dead that they might understand the full meaning of his coming.

The first thing is that Jesus seems to just appear in the room. He walks not through doors; he is just there. he says, “*Peace be with you.*”

The first word of the Risen Lord, the first gift of the Risen Lord, is: “I give you my peace, all that was lost through sin and failure is now restored because I give you myself. My peace is myself and I am here with you now and I will be with you all the days of your life.”

The second gift: he shows them his hands and his side. And he stood for one thing, he stood for love. Divine Mercy Sunday.

And that is why he invites his disciples to touch his side, out of which water and blood flowed, and to touch his hands, where the nails pierced them. He was telling them that this was the sign of his love and this he would carry into everlasting life. This kind of love is self-sacrificing love. He teaches us how to love, with a full heart. The sacrifice is not supposed to be a terrible thing. It is made joyful and glad because it is the price of a whole new life.

The third gift: the third gift that he gives is the gift of God’s forgiveness. All is forgiven. Sin separates us from Jesus, who loves us. Sin makes us hide our face from God who loves us, a God who aches for us, a God who comes and dies for us. All this is erased by Jesus the Lord, for he has come to make it firm and everlasting, that nothing, no matter how much fear or how much difficulty or how strong the urge, nothing will ever separate him from us. When God knocks on our door of life, be open to it.

Forgiveness is a reason for joy because the peace of God is God Himself. The joy of the disciples is knowing that God is with them. God is inseparable from His people. God became a reality for us through Jesus. He gives us His truth and when we fall or slip for one reason or another He is there waiting for us and He will never to be taken from us. Saying, “*I am sorry,*” once again we experience the presence of Jesus our Lord, the man of sorrows.

And so, when Jesus came on Easter Day into their upper room, it was filled with fear. And Jesus dispelled the fear and said, “*I am here. See me. I have come as I promised. I would rise on the third day.*” And so, when the disciples told Thomas, he was not going to believe a second time. There is nothing worse than losing your faith and it’s very hard to gain it back. In fact, it took the appearance of Jesus himself. “*Thomas, come over and put your hand in the wounds and put your hand into my side and believe. Do not be a disbeliever but a believer.*” And then Thomas saw Jesus for the very first time, and for the first time he could see who Jesus was and his only response was, “*My Lord and my God.*”

We reach our deeper understanding of who God is in day-to-day life when we turn all over to God and trust, it was Thomas who became the model of a believer, one who trusted and one who gave his whole life over to Jesus. What he did was he opened not his mind, not his own ideas of what he was going to do with his life, but he was freed in surrender to Jesus whom he loved with his whole heart.

When Jesus sends us out and says, “Now go through the whole world and tell the people all is forgiven.” “You are to bring them the good news that God is not up in His heavens, He is walking through life with you, the joy of life, the pain of life, never a step behind but always with you, and He will bring you safely home.”

And this is the reason for Easter joy.

So let us today rejoice Jesus is the reason to be glad. Jesus is our companion who will never leave us and will bring us safely home.

Bishop Malone asked me (Elaine Gallion) to share the message below which he received from Mr. Tom Sweeney, a parishioner of St. Jude Parish, Benton:

This Lent Jesus Christ is being crucified in The Ukraine. The situation is completely dire, the suffering is immense, thousands of innocent noncombatants have been wantonly killed and over 4 million people have been forced to flee their homes to seek safety in neighboring countries. What has been happening in Eastern Europe for the past five weeks are the most momentous events in the lifetimes of most of us! None of us can say how this will end, but one thing is certain, this Lent the people of the Ukraine were tragically joined to the Passion of the Christ and we MUST help them in this, their darkest hour. We have an opportunity to aid them by volunteering to work a parking gate shift at the Spring Louisiana State Fair in Shreveport from April 28th to May 8th. We need to fill 151 shifts working as parking gate attendants. You will be tasked with collecting a \$5 parking fee from each car that passes through your assigned area. The work is light and easy, and the time goes by fast. Instead of being paid for your work you would be pledging that money to the Ukraine Solidarity Refugee Relief Fund administered by the Knights of Columbus. 100% of the \$15,480 we can raise will be used for humanitarian relief. There will be a Shreveport Police Officer at every location to ensure everyone's safety. You may sign up for more than one shift if you are able. Teenagers sixteen years of age and up may also work at the gates accompanied by an adult. Ukraine is 85% Christian and millions of them are Catholic. Please help in aiding the Refugees from Ukraine, by doing so you will be Eucharist to them. As dutiful Christians we know that on this earth God's work must truly be our own. In Revelation, John the Evangelist tells us what we can expect as followers of the risen Jesus: distress, endurance, and a kingdom. Although we are only eight days into our fifty-day Easter feasting, we cannot ignore the distress weighing down our daily lives. Jesus' resurrection does not erase individual suffering, but his glorious triumph over death cultivates endurance in our hearts. We remember that Jesus did not spare himself, and we ask for the strength to endure as he did. Imitating Christ helps us grow as members of God's royal family. As beloved citizens of the Kingdom of God, we recognize our kinship with all people. Peter demonstrates his care for others as he heals multitudes of broken, suffering people. In the Gospel, Thomas accepts his own spiritual healing when Jesus helps him to believe. In times of difficulty, survival, and glory, we borrow Thomas' declaration of faith: "My Lord and my God!"

Sign-up sheet for VBS and Altar Server Camp are at the Narthex of our church. Guarantee your spot by signing in early.


