

New Horizons - Forgiving Peter

THE LAST SUPPER

At the Last Supper Peter told Jesus, "Lord, I am ready to go with you both to prison and to death! Why can I not follow you now? I will lay down my life for you!" So he said, "I tell you, Peter, before the rooster crows tonight, you will say three times that you do not know me. (Luke 33-34)!"

THE TRIAL OF JESUS

Later, while Jesus was being tried in front of Annas the Father-in-law of Caiaphas the High Priest, Peter stood in the courtyard warming himself by a charcoal fire. Three times Peter was asked if he was a follower of Jesus. Three times Peter denied that he even knew Jesus. Afterwards, Peter felt great guilt. But even after denying his Lord, Peter still decided to return to the community.

THE RESURRECTION APPEARANCE

The Gospel for today's Mass begins with seven disciples of Jesus who are standing on the shore of the Sea of Galilee and who decide to go fishing. They do not catch any fish. While they are fishing Jesus stands on the shore as the day is breaking. The dawning of a new day is symbolic of a new day of salvation which breaks into the world through the resurrection of our Lord.

As the sun rises Jesus calls out and asks the disciples if they have caught anything. The disciples do not recognize the Lord who speaks to them from the shore. They have caught nothing and the Lord tells them to throw the net over the right side of the boat. After casting the net over the right side of the boat they begin to bring in a large catch.

The Beloved disciple tells Peter that it is the Lord that is speaking to them. Peter who is lightly clad jumps into the water and swims to the shore. The disciples pull the net to the shore and the net does not tear. We learn that they drag 153 large fish to the shore. This large catch is symbolic of the universal mission of the apostles. The nets' not tearing represents the success of their mission.

The entire scene shows the Risen Christ coming to the disciples in the midst of their ordinary lives. The scene reminds us that the Risen Christ is with us in the midst of our ordinary lives.

On the shore Jesus is cooking bread and fish over a charcoal fire. The disciples provide some of the fish that they have caught to Jesus. This meal is symbolic of the Eucharist during which Christ was present to the early Church community and during which Christ continues to be present to us. In fact, Christ feeds us in this Eucharist.

PETER AND THE RISEN CHRIST

The Risen Christ invites Peter to walk with him along the shore. Peter has denied knowing Jesus three times. In order to forgive Peter Christ asks him three times if Peter loves him. Each time Peter tells the Lord that he does love him. Jesus asks Peter to "feed my lambs", "tend my sheep", and "feed my sheep." Christ shows Peter that to love him means to love those whom Christ loves. In this dialogue Christ is calling Peter to be the chief shepherd of the Church. The Lord finally explains to Peter how he will ultimately show his love for Christ and the sheep through his martyrdom. This scene from the Gospel shows that in his love the Risen Christ allows us to begin again as he allowed Peter to begin again.

CONCLUSION

Just as Christ invites Peter to a new relationship after he had sinned, so the Risen Christ does for us. Christ desired Reconciliation and unity with Peter and he desires the same reconciliation and unity with us. We experience this reconciliation, forgiveness, unity and the strength not to sin in the Mass. As we have opened ourselves to the reconciliation and forgiveness of the Risen Christ through the Liturgy of the Word let us now open ourselves to the reconciliation and forgiveness of Christ through the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

GOD'S OVERFLOWING KINDNESS

The superabundance of God's kindness ties all of today's readings together. Especially when life overwhelms us, the Lord provides all we need, and then some. In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter takes the lead when facing the Sanhedrin. We might expect the man who denied Jesus to crumble under the imposing glare of the high priest. Instead, the Holy Spirit helps him testify to his faith in Jesus Christ. What Peter had lacked before, courage and conviction, God provides in abundance. Similarly, today's Gospel shows Jesus providing a surplus of fish for the disciples. They have no luck fishing until the Lord intercedes. Jesus supplies an almost ridiculous number of fish, and he cooks it for them, too. As our reading from Revelation affirms, the overflowing riches of God require constant praise. Countless creatures—"everything in the universe"—cry out to honor the Lord, forever and ever.
