**New Horizons:
Love One Another
By: Fr. Mark Watson**

This Gospel takes place at the end of Jesus' life. He now speaks to the disciples about that which is most important to him.

After Judas has left Jesus cries out "Now is the Son of Man glorified." This statement is an indication that the hour of Jesus has been set in motion. Jesus will soon be lifted up on the cross and draw all people to himself. The cross is the time and place where the glory of God will be revealed. The death of Jesus is not merely humiliation but a victory.

One question during this time of Easter is, "How did the members of the early Church continue without the physical presence of the Jesus who lived with them?" Jesus gives the disciples and us an answer that seems easy but in practice is very difficult, "Love one another." Truly we can truly continue the work of Jesus through loving one another. The self-giving love of Jesus is to be the pattern of how the disciples are to live their lives in the absence of Jesus. The greatest, most tangible sign of discipleship is the love that the disciples have for one another.

The starting point of love is divine love. Because we have experienced God's love in Jesus Christ we are to go and share this love with others. Jesus gives his disciples a new commandment which matches his example. "Love one another as I have loved you." The disciples understand how to love based on the love that they have seen lived out by Jesus. This was especially true in the crucifixion of Jesus.

Like the disciples we are to love others. For us the love of Christ is the most powerful sign of love. Jesus' death on the cross is the clearest example of Jesus' love for the world. Our lives are to be rooted in the love of Jesus.

The following prayer written by the martyr, St. John Perboyre, helps me to understand today's Gospel. Saint John Perboyre was martyred on September 11, 1840.

"Divine Savior, transform me into yourself. May my hands be your hands. May my tongue be your tongue. Grant that every faculty of my body may serve only to glorify you.

Above all, transform my soul and all its powers that my memory, my will, and my affections may be the memory, the will and the affections of you.

I pray you to change in me all that is not of you. Grant that I may live but in you and by you and for you, that I may truly say with St. Paul, "I live, now not I. but Christ lives in me (Galatians 2:20)."

THE BOOK OF REVELATION

The second reading is taken from the Book of Revelation and speaks of God's future love. This reading shows that God is making all things new. The resurrection of Jesus is the beginning of a process which will reach its goal when God's Kingdom comes in its fullness. The New Jerusalem represents the people of God that is now being transformed by God. When God's Kingdom comes in its fullness, the former creation will pass away and, all evil will be destroyed. Creation will not be destroyed but renewed. This reading speaks of the love of God which will bring about the final transformation of heaven and earth. This transformation is now beginning in our lives. The reading reminds us that God's love is eternal. It was present in creation, continued in the life of Jesus and will continue in the final transformation of heaven and earth. God will be forever with us as our sovereign Lord.

CONCLUSION

Dear Lord you have called us to love one another as you have loved us. Please bless us with the grace to love one another in this way. May this love shape all of the relationships in our life?

MAKING ALL THINGS NEW

Although we are five full weeks into the celebration of Easter, today's readings focus on newness. Our Easter food leftovers may be long gone, but the readings insist on every moment's freshness in the risen Jesus. The Acts of the Apostles depicts Paul and Barnabas reflecting on all the innovative work that God has done with them. They have traveled hundreds of miles, introducing faith in Jesus Christ to all who listen, even Gentiles. For the dutiful Jewish scholar Paul, preaching to Gentiles is a completely unique development. Jesus calls Paul, and us, not to be afraid of new challenges: as John the Evangelist reports in Revelation, Jesus promises to "make all things new." In the Gospel reading, Jesus even gives us a new commandment. The Hebrew Scriptures overflow with commandments, but Jesus knows we need one more, perfect mission: "love one another."
