



Sixth Sunday of Easter 2022

John 14:23-29

ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

From the earliest years of the Church, it was seen that God willed that the Church be opened to all people. Since salvation was from the Jews, shouldn't non-Jewish members of the church live out the entire law in order to be saved?

Paul was persecuted for proclaiming that God's salvation was for all people even those that didn't live out the entire Jewish law. Our readings show that God is working in a new way, as God is saving those who do not live out the entire law.

At the Council of Jerusalem, it was decided that the Gentiles did not have to follow all of the Jewish laws but had only to adhere to certain restrictions, regarding sexual practice, idolatry and food. This seems like a good compromise to us. For the people of the early church the idea that one did not have to live the entire law in order to be saved was radical. The first reading reminds us that God's salvation is open to people of all cultures and lands.

REVELATION

The reading from the Book of Revelation gives us a symbolic description of the Church, the new Jerusalem. It had a massive high wall. With twelve gates and on which were inscribed the names of the twelve tribes of the Israelites. The foundation of the city had twelve courses of stones on which were written the twelve names of the twelve apostles of the lamb. The story of the twelve tribes and the twelve apostles are foundational to the identity of the redeemed community. There is no temple in the city, as the new temple is the Lord God and the Lamb. God had dwelt in the temple of Jerusalem, now God dwells in and among his people. The redeemed community is open to all people.

John 14:23-29

The one who loves Jesus and keeps his word will experience the abiding presence of Christ and the Father. The one who does not love Christ does not hear his word and thus does not have access to the revelation of God. Oneness with God is to be understood in terms of love. God will love those who love Christ. Christ and God will come to those who love Christ and make their home with them. Those who love and believe in Christ can look forward to a future in which Christ and the Father will abide with them.

The Paraclete, the Holy Spirit, who the Father will send in Christ's name will teach believers all things, and help them to remember all that Christ said. During his life Jesus dwelt with his disciples. In the future the Holy Spirit will replace the presence of Jesus. Jesus taught while on earth. The Paraclete continues the work and mission of Jesus through the teaching of the Spirit and through helping the disciples remember the words of Jesus. The beginning of the time of the Paraclete marks a time of love, belief, joy and peace. Jesus is initiating an in-between time marked by his absence. The Spirit Paraclete will continue the revealing task of Jesus. The Paraclete means lawyer, advocate or counselor.

Jesus will give peace to the disciples which is from the Father. In this peace the disciples will do greater works than Jesus. Jesus challenges the disciples to not be troubled. Untroubled hearts are the guarantee that the disciples have heard the words of Jesus and are holding fast to them. In place of fear the disciples are to experience love, deepened belief and peace and joy.

ACTIVE PRESENCE OF THE EUCHARIST

One of the ways that we experience the truth of today's Gospel is the celebration of the Mass. Christ and the Holy Spirit are present among us through the celebration of the Eucharist. As we receive the whole person of Christ in the Mass may we make Christ present throughout our lives!

RETURNING TO ORDINARY LIFE

Six weeks into our Easter rejoicing, the Church gives us readings today that start preparing us for a return to ordinary life. The Acts of the Apostles and the Gospel both dwell on proper daily behavior for followers of Jesus, while the reading from Revelation reminds us why we bother with laws at all. In Acts, leaders of the church meet to discuss which essential elements of the Mosaic Law converts must obey if they wish to be disciples of Jesus Christ. John's Gospel reflects back to the Last Supper discourse when Jesus himself emphasizes the importance of obeying God's commandments. Observing God's law, says Jesus, shows a desire to be intimate with the Lord. We follow rules not for their own sake, but to love God and neighbor better. This more excellent love brings us closer to Revelation's vision of paradise, gleaming with "the splendor of God."
