

NEW HORIZONS DIOCESAN STEWARDSHIP APPEAL: TO KNOW, LOVE AND SERVE

The Diocesan Stewardship Appeal takes place this weekend. The title of the Appeal this year is TO KNOW, LOVE AND SERVE. As we begin the Diocesan Stewardship Appeal, I ask that all parishioners prayerfully consider donating to this important campaign.

This year the Diocesan Stewardship Appeal feels different. We normally begin the appeal in February. We are beginning the appeal in mid-July. Unlike other years, the parish does not have a specific dollar goal to achieve. The focus this year is for those who have not given in the past to become a part of this campaign and for those who have given in the past to continue to give.

For me the word "Stewardship" which is in the title of the campaign is significant. God has not only made us members but stewards of the Diocese of Shreveport. As stewards God has given us ownership of the diocese and we are responsible to care for our diocese. I invite all parishioners to give to the appeal. I want the bishop to see that a high percentage of the parishioners of the churches of Sacred Heart and St. Mary of the Pines participated in the appeal.

Two thoughts come to mind as I write this article. First, while we are dedicated to our parish as Catholics, we are also part of something larger. We are not only members of this church community; we are also part of the Diocese of Shreveport. Giving to the appeal is an important way to support the diocese. Second, just as we budget money in order to meet the needs of our families, so Bishop Malone has to budget money in order to meet the needs of the ministries of our diocese. It is therefore important that we give so that the diocese will have the funds to meet its budget.

Our gifts this year are essential in covering the education costs of the seminarians who are currently journeying to ordination for our diocese. Next year we look forward to the ordination of Gabriel Cisneros and Kilby Tingle.

Appeal dollars also support our retired and infirm priests. These funds provide them stability and comfort. In 2022, a significant portion of appeal funding is dedicated to offering our retired priests a well-deserved quality of life in their later years. We continue to benefit from the ministry of the retired priests of the diocese.

The Catholic Connection is fully funded by the Appeal. This unique, award-winning magazine is sent out to every known Catholic household in the diocese free of charge on a monthly basis.

The Appeal helps to fund the diocesan Office of Hispanic Ministry. Within our parish these funds have helped fund the Busqueda and Emmaus Retreats and Viñedo de Raquel retreats. St. Mary of the Pines is a parish that most often benefits from the work of the Office of Hispanic Ministry.

Funds from the Appeal assists the work of Saint Vincent de Paul Society and Catholic Charities. Catholic Charities offers assistance with employment searches, rent, utility bills, food, clothing and financial planning. Catholic Charities, also continues to provide assistance to those in need of critical immigration services. SVDP assists the vulnerable through home visitation in order to assist with the basic necessities of life, also Appeal dollars assist the Saint Vincent de Paul Society within our parish.

Our diocese takes a leadership role in organizing and supporting Pro-life programs and family life outreach programs. These programs are assisted through dollars from the Appeal.

NEW HORIZONS PRAYER By: Fr. Mark Watson

INTRODUCTION

At the beginning of today's Gospel Jesus is at prayer. Jesus prays to God at the important times in his ministry. This includes during his baptism, before he chooses the Twelve, before the sermon on the plain, before the Transfiguration and especially during his passion. We are to do the same.

In today's Gospel the disciples ask Jesus to teach them to pray as John the Baptist taught his disciples to pray. Jesus teaches the disciples how to pray but in a different form than in the Gospel of Matthew. Jesus teaches the disciples to pray as follows.

"Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread And forgive us our sins For we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, And do not subject us to the final test. (Luke 11: 2-4)"

These words recognize the holiness of God. God is absolutely different than all created things. The Lord's Prayer asks for the coming of God's Kingdom. We are praying that the rule of God be made effective in the world of humans. In the Lord's Prayer we pray for the bread that we need each day. We ask not only for bread, but that God give us what is necessary for each day. We ask God to forgive us our sins since we ourselves are willing to forgive others. Can we truly make this statement to God or is there someone we need to forgive in order to receive God's forgiveness? Finally, we pray that we will not be led into continual testing in our lives nor at the end of time.

Jesus then follows the Lord's Prayer with the parable of a man who has a friend who comes to him in the middle of the night and asks for three loaves of bread. The man from within the house sends his friend away since he and his children are in bed. In the end the man from within the house **does** get up and gives the friend whatever he needs not because of their friendship but because the other is shamelessly bold. The man inside the house decides to help because his friend won't take "NO" for an answer.

We are not to be afraid to ask God for what we need!!! We must **boldly** ask for what we need. We shouldn't worry about what God can do or will be willing to do. God is not like the sleepy friend. The sleepy friend helped because of the shamelessness of his friend. How much more will God listen to us. As the man outside the house, we should have a sense of shameless resolve.

Prayer is conversing with God. While at times it seems that God is not listening, we should continue to pray. God is love and our prayer is a response to God's great love. We must have faith that God desires to answer our prayers. Jesus thus says the following powerful words. "Ask and it will be given to you. Seek and you will find. Knock and the door will be opened for you. For everyone who asks receives. The one who seeks finds. The one who knocks will have the door opened (Luke 11:9-10)."

We are to have faith that God knows what we need before we ask, and God will answer our prayers in his great love. The answer may be "no" or, may not be in the time that we desire. Like children with human parents, we can trust that our request will not be answered by malice or trickery; we will not find a snake or scorpion where we had expected a fish or egg. Let us give thanks to God for the many ways that God has answered our prayers. Let us thank God especially for the ways in which God has blessed us in surprising ways.

CONVERSATION WITH GOD

Prayer is our focus this weekend. In the Gospel, Jesus gives his disciples, and us, the Lord's Prayer, which we have cherished through the centuries. The first two words encompass much about our faith—unity among all Christians (Our), and a sense that we are in a deeply bonded relationship with God (Father).

In Genesis, we see Abraham in conversational prayer, in his creaturely humility before his Creator, seeking mercy and compassion for the innocent. The psalm is a lyrical prayer of thanksgiving and praise for the God who answered the sincere prayers of a people who had called out for help, showing them mercy. In Luke's Gospel, the disciples want to pray like Jesus, with the same intimacy—to experience God as Abba in the depths of their being.

Do we try to talk to God? Do we listen for answers? This relationship is always a work in progress.
