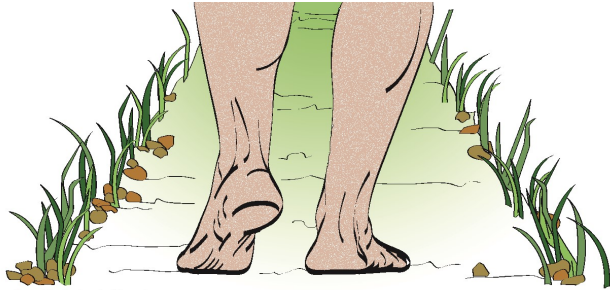

New Horizons
Striving to Enter the Kingdom

In today's Gospel Jesus is journeying to Jerusalem. As he journeys a man asks, "Lord, are those who are being saved few in number (Luke 13:23)?" Instead of giving a number Jesus challenges the man to "Struggle to enter through the narrow door (Luke 13:14)." Or in other words act in such a way as to be one who is saved.

This Gospel reminds me of the life of Cardinal Joseph Bernardin. As chairperson of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops Respect Life Committee, in the 1980's, Cardinal Bernardin taught about "The Seamless Garment" approach to respecting all human life. This approach holds that all human life has dignity and that we to stand against all threats to human life: the threat of abortion, euthanasia, the death penalty, nuclear war.

On August 19, 1996 his doctor told him that the pancreatic cancer that had previously gone into remission had now returned. Instead of being overwhelmed by his cancer, he stated that "Death is a friend as it is a transition from earthly life to heavenly life." As he approached death, he lived his life with a new urgency. His cancer helped to refocus his ministry. While he was the Archbishop of one of the largest Catholic dioceses in the world he decided to spend time with the "sick and the troubled." He went out of his way to spend time with people who suffered. One story which reflects how he reached out to those who suffered happened at a prayer vigil for a young man who had died of cancer. As he walked up the aisle he said that various individuals handed him the names and phone numbers of others who were sick with cancer. He took the time to visit each of the individuals on the slips that he had been given. He died November 16, 1996.

In the Gospel Jesus is asks, "Will only a few people be saved (Luke 13:23)?" Jesus does not tell us how many people will be saved. Instead, Jesus emphasizes the difficulty of entering the Kingdom of God and the importance of striving to enter the Kingdom. Entering the kingdom is not automatic. No one can presume that they have been saved. While salvation is a free and unmerited gift of God, we must respond to God's invitation and squeeze past the many, in order to be one of those who is saved. In the Pope's Apostolic Exhortation on holiness, "Rejoice and Be Glad," the Pope writes that we are all called to be saints, to live lives of holiness. We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do, wherever we find ourselves. (Pope Francis, Rejoice and Be Glad)

The Master will rise and shut the door. You will say, "Lord, open to us." He will answer you, "I do not know you, where you are from." Then you will say, "We ate and drank in your presence. You taught in our streets," and he will say to you, "I do not know you, where are you from." Depart from me all you workers of wickedness (Luke 13:25-27)!" "You ate with us." The question becomes not have we spent time with Jesus, but have we heard the Lord and has His Word changed us? Does the Lord know us? Do we know the Lord, or only do we know about the Lord? How well do we listen to the Lord in the Liturgy of the Word and in receiving him in faith in the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

I Tim 2:4 says, God "desires everyone to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth."

In Jesus' vision the destiny of all people is the kingdom of God. The invitation of the Kingdom is offered to all. All must act upon the invitation. Both Jews and Gentiles will be included in the Kingdom of God. In the Gospel of Luke, some of those who are not supposed to be included in the Kingdom are included and some of those who are supposed to be included are not included. Many will be surprised at those who make it into the heavenly banquet.

May we strive to enter the Kingdom. May we also lead others to the Kingdom!

GOD'S PEOPLE GATHER

Our readings today remind us of the larger story of the Bible, of God's purposes and promises for the world. Because of humanity's rejection of God, as told in Genesis, human communities were first dispersed. Isaiah proclaims that one day God will gather these communities to be healed and reconciled with God. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus echoes Isaiah and teaches that all peoples in God's promised future “will recline at table in the kingdom of God.” Notice that in Isaiah, the nations coming to God do not lose their ethnicity or unique identity. They bring their own distinct cultural gifts to God's table. Each people has its unique history with God, has received distinct blessings from God, and each is accountable to God. Today, we live in a global and multi-cultural Church. When God's diverse peoples gather in worship today, may we honor and celebrate each other's gifts and blessings.

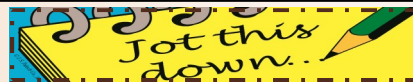
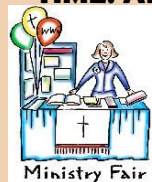
