New Horizons The Resurrection of the Dead By: Fr. Mark Watson, Pastor

The first reading is taken from the Second Book of Maccabees which was written 150 years before the birth of Jesus. When this book was written the Jewish people in some areas were beginning to believe in the resurrection of the dead.

Today's reading takes place during the reign of the Seleucid King Antiochus Epiphanes IV (175-164 BCE). In the reading seven sons and their mother are being tortured for not being willing to give up their Jewish faith. Each of these martyrs die for being unwilling to eat pork. The brothers and their mother die with hope in the resurrection of the dead which will bring abundant life. They believe that after death God will raise up their bodies. They recognize that God is more powerful than the king Antiochus Epiphanes IV.

The heroic testimony of these martyrs leads us to question whether we truly believe in the resurrection as the destiny of our lives.

Gospel

In today's Gospel the Sadducees do not believe the dead will rise to new life and thus they try to prove that resurrection from the dead is foolishness. They use the example of leverite marriage. In this marriage if the husband died without his wife having a child, she had to marry his brother. In the story a wife does not have children with her initial husband and six of his brothers. She finally dies. The Sadducees' ask, whose wife will she be in eternal life? Jesus says that God gives life in creation and continues to sustain life past one's life in this world. God has ordered life to continue forever.

Jesus does not give us details about the resurrection. He tells us that the resurrection is a reality and those that rise will be "children of God." Jesus ends by making the point that God is a God of the living and not of the dead and that this was shown when Moses referred to God as the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob at the burning bush.

We are to trust in the love of God as St. Paul writes, "For I am convinced that neither death nor life...will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39).

The Resurrection of the Dead

We believe that Jesus died and rose from the dead. Just as the body of Jesus was radically transformed so will our bodies be radically transformed. The resurrection of Jesus means that Christ is alive and lives among us. The resurrection of Jesus inaugurates the end time that brings God's judgement and promised salvation. Already we have begun to live in this new age.

In each Eucharist we not only remember the death and resurrection of our risen Lord but we receive the risen Christ in his Word, in our worship as a church community, in the priest and in the reception of his Body and Blood. As well in the Eucharist we experience the eternal heavenly liturgy and we pray for the final coming of our risen Lord. As we celebrate the Eucharist we have faith in the risen Christ and are strengthened as we journey to eternal life.

May our lives show forth the risen Christ who truly lives in us. Certainly, the best proof of the resurrection is the faith of the Christian community. Like the members of the early Church, we are called to bring the good news of the resurrection to the ends of the earth. May our lives not only proclaim the resurrection but may we have confidence that the world is moving to final eternal salvation as a result of Jesus' resurrection. May we always be filled with Easter joy!!!

ETERNAL LIFE

What happens after we die? Most religions and philosophies provide some notion of this, but we are confounded by the mystery of it all. Today's readings give us a glimpse through the faith of martyrs and in the words of Jesus. In the Old Testament reading, the Maccabee brothers assert with total confidence that the God who gave them life would also raise them to eternal life. This was not universally accepted in ancient Israel. The Sadducees, who denied any resurrection of the dead, try to trap Jesus with a hypothetical riddle. Jesus, known for turning such things around, dismisses their

unbelief, noting that even Moses knew that all are alive in God. Saint Paul tells the Thessalonians that we live in everlasting encouragement and hope, and Psalm 17 echoes this with words of faith that we will see God's face, waking in God's loving presence.
