

### NEW HORIZONS HOPE IN THE SECOND COMING By: Fr. Mark Watson, Pastor

As we come to the end of the Church year the focus of our readings turns to the final coming of the Son of Man. The Gospel is Apocalyptic. This type of literature uses graphic images to portray God's future salvation. Apocalyptic literature was written to remind people who are persecuted that God is in control of history and that God will punish the sinful.

Apocalyptic literature shows that those who suffer in this life, can be assured of eternal life at the end of time. Therefore, they can live with faith and hope. The Gospel of Luke was written by Christians in southern Greece persecuted by the Roman Empire. It is thought to be written from 80 AD to 85 AD. As in all Apocalyptic readings this Gospel reading reminds us that our focus as Christians is not only on this world but on the end of time.

The Gospel opens with Jesus and his disciples visiting the temple of Jerusalem. Jesus is portrayed as a prophet who prophesies what will happen before the city of Jerusalem and its temple fall and the coming of the Son of Man. Jesus says that before the fall of the city the disciples will be hated by all and will be arrested and led before kings and governors. Jesus says that "I will give you a wisdom in speaking that all of your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute." (Luke 21:15) By their patience and perseverance, they will secure their lives and be saved.

Jesus promises to give each of us wisdom in speaking. The Scripture scholar David Knight says that in the midst of the worse catastrophes in our lives our focus should not be on what is happening but instead on how we will respond. In good times and in bad we are to bear witness to Jesus Christ in action and in word. We are not only given the words and wisdom that we need in times of trouble but also the spiritual gifts. May we have confidence in the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives as we go through difficulty. At the end of the reading we read, "When all these things start to happen, stand up! Lift up your heads, because your liberation is coming near." (Luke 21:28) Thus the reading calls us to moral rectitude, prayer, concern for others, and endurance. This Sunday is Stewardship Sunday. This is a Sunday in which we all reflect on how we use the time, talent and treasure with which God has given us for the upbuilding of our parish.

#### STEWARSHIP SUNDAY

First, I commit myself and the parish staff to being Good Stewards of the treasure and talent of our parish. I define the leadership of a pastor as helping people to fully live out their faith. In order to do this the parish has begun a parish planning process. I believe this plan will help the parish to do just that, to fully live out our faith.

Each of us has been blessed by God with various gifts. We are called to develop those gifts and give them back to God with increase. I see this new Three-Year plan as a way of helping parishioners to both become involved in current ministries and in new ministries. This should both build up our parish and offer fulfillment to the lives of parishioners.

God blesses us not only with our talents but also with our finances. Since these are gifts of God, we are called to give them back to God with increase. The church asks that we tithe to our parish. We are called to give 10% of our income. I ask that you give 5% of your income to your church community and 5% to other valued charities. The parish is very blessed with beautiful liturgies and strong ministry. This is all made possible through your generosity. I believe that our parish will continue to grow. I thank not only God but you for the generosity which will make this growth possible.

## THE END OF DAYS

As we prepare for next Sunday's feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, we hear descriptions of dire and catastrophic events. Sometimes it seems as though we ourselves are living in the end times, when life as we currently know it will cease for everyone. In answer to what must have been a fearful question, Jesus does not sugarcoat his foretelling of future days. Nor does the Old Testament prophet Malachi flinch from his pronouncements upon an evil world. Saint Paul, still writing to the Thessalonians, warns them prophetically against succumbing to "The End Is Near" syndrome—indolence in the face of the final days. However, both Jesus and Malachi speak of the recompense for living a just life—healing and vindication.
