New Horizons
Christ the King 2022

The Feast of Christ the King was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 in order to counteract socialism and secularism in the world. The Feast honors Christ's sovereignty over all persons, families, nations, and the whole universe. The Feast challenges us to change our lives and so to prepare for our final encounter with the Lord Jesus Christ our King.

2 Samuel 5:1-3

The first reading presents David accepting the God given role of King of the tribes of God's people. David will rule for 40 years. The reign of David foreshadows Jesus' reign. Yahweh makes a covenant with David that there will always be a leader on the throne of David. The kingdoms of Israel and Judah waited for this messianic King. The continuation of the reign of David is best fulfilled in the life of Jesus.

Luke 23:35-43

WHO IS JESUS?

On the cross of Jesus, the message is placed: "This is the King of the Jews" (Luke 23:38). In the midst of the humiliation and pain of the cross Jesus shows us what it means to be king. Through his forgiveness of those who crucified him Jesus shows himself to be a king of compassion.

RESPONSES TO JESUS

"The people stood by and watched" (Luke 23:35). This line is important as it contrasts the people's response with that of the rulers, soldiers, and the "bad" criminal all of whom mock and scoff at Jesus. Ultimately, they show their faith through the sorrow that they show for Jesus at his death.

The statements of those who jeer at Jesus all contain a true Christological confession. Jesus is the "Christ of God," "the King of the Jews," and the "Christ." The leaders mocked Jesus by saying, "He saved others. Let him save himself if this is God's Messiah, the elect one" (Luke 23:35). The soldiers mocked him by offering him vinegar and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself" (Luke 23:37).

On the cross one criminal mocks Jesus, "Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" (Luke 23:39). The other criminal responded to the bad criminal, "Don't you even fear God? For you are under the same sentence! In our case it is just, for we are receiving what we deserve for our actions. But this man has done nothing wrong.....Jesus remember me when you enter your kingdom!" (Luke 23:40-43).

Even on the cross Jesus reaches out and **saved him who was lost**. Today's Gospel ends with Jesus solemnly responding to the "good" criminal. "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise" (Luke 23:43). Today speaks of the present reality of this criminal. He now resides in Paradise. For us who are faithful, we will live forever with Jesus, united with our compassionate King. That journey of salvation begins today.

OUR RESPONSE

What is our response to Jesus? Our King of Mercy calls us to have faith in Him. May we continually decide to accept the forgiveness that Christ our King offers.

THE TRUE KINGSHIP OF JESUS CHRIST

What kind of King is Jesus? How do you envision him? Remembering that they were promised a king from the line of David, the Israelites hoped for a Messiah who would set their political problems aright and bring about a worldly kingdom of Judaic power. Even Psalm 122 seems to describe this type of ruler. Luke's Gospel today shreds that image after the whip of the Roman soldiers tore at Jesus' flesh. Still, the Romans flaunted the traditional notion with their ironic inscription above King Jesus' crown of thorns. Soldiers and ordinary people jeered the royal title at him. Yet the throne of Jesus was the cross of Christ, from which he dispensed kingly mercy and justice toward the humble criminal who shared his execution. Writing to the Colossians, Saint Paul describes the truth about Jesus and his kingship, using words like fullness, peace, and forgiveness. So let us go rejoicing!

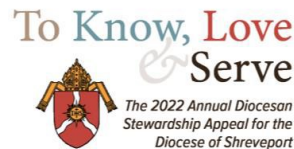
